

Mass Layoff Statistics 4th Quarter 1999

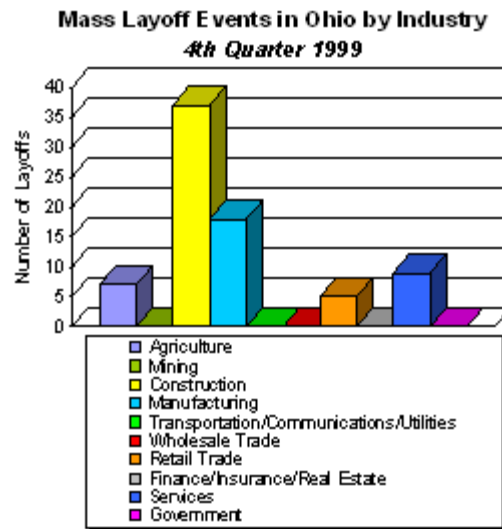
During the period October through December 1999, there were 80 mass layoff events in Ohio resulting in 16,692 separations.

Mass Layoff Events by Industry

Forty-six percent of the total number of mass layoff events occurred in Construction, representing 39% of all separations. Manufacturing facilities accounted for 23% of all mass layoff events and 19% of all separations.

Mass Layoff Events by Primary Reason

Events that were seasonal in nature accounted for 59% of all mass layoffs and 63% of all separations. Contract completion was responsible for 18% of total mass layoffs and 19% of workers separated. Included in the 80 mass layoffs for Ohio were 3 actual establishment closures with 488 separations.
