

Mass Layoff Statistics 2nd Quarter 2000

During the period April through June 2000, there were 68 mass layoff events in Ohio, a decrease of 9 events from second quarter 1999. This resulted in 12,593 separations, an over the year decrease of 154 from the second quarter 1999 total of 12,747 separations.

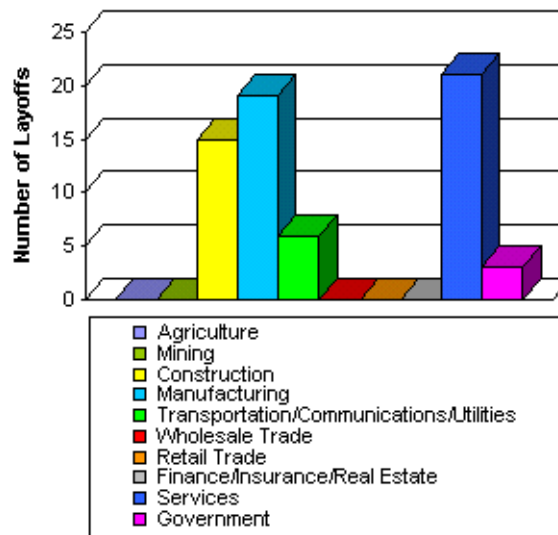
Mass Layoff Events by Industry

Thirty-one percent of the total number of mass layoff events occurred in Services, representing 28% of all separations. Manufacturing facilities accounted for 28% of all mass layoff events and 33% of all separations.

Mass Layoff Events by Primary Reason

Events that were seasonal in nature accounted for 37% of all mass layoffs and 30% of all separations. Contract completion was responsible for 32% of total mass layoffs and 33% of workers separated. Included in the 68 mass layoffs for Ohio were 9 actual establishment closures with 2,610 separations.
