

Mass Layoff Statistics 3rd Quarter 2000

During the period July through September 2000, there were 48 mass layoff events in Ohio, an increase of 5 events over third quarter 1999. This resulted in 9,736 separations, an over the year increase of 3,152 over the third quarter 1999 total of 6,584 separations.

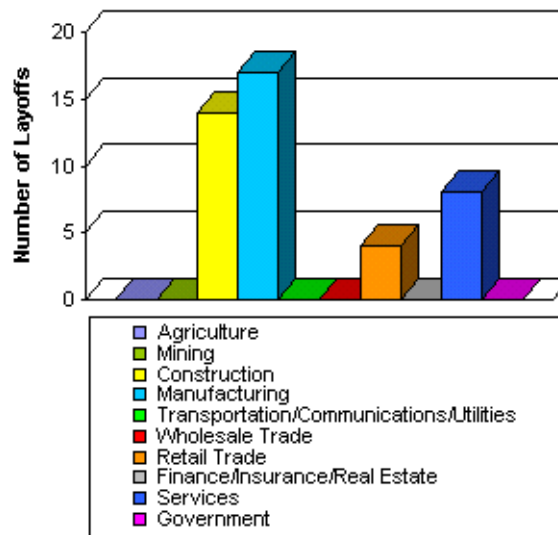
Mass Layoff Events by Industry

Manufacturing facilities accounted for 35% of all mass layoff events and 35% of all separations. Twenty-nine percent of the total number of mass layoff events occurred in construction establishments, representing 23% of all separations.

Mass Layoff Events by Primary Reason

Contract completion was responsible for 35% of total mass layoffs and 27% of workers separated. Events resulting from slack work accounted for 17% of all mass layoffs and 16% of all separations. Included in the 48 mass layoffs for Ohio were 12 actual establishment closures with 3,834 separations.
