Mass Layoff Statistics 1st Quarter 2001


During the period January through March 2001, there were 99 mass layoff events in Ohio, an increase of 16 events over first quarter 2000. This resulted in 16,035 separations, an over the year increase of 4,287 from the first quarter 2000 total of 11,748 separations.

Mass Layoff Events by Industry

Manufacturing facilities accounted for 51% of all mass layoff events and 53% of all separations. Twenty-one percent of the total number of mass layoff events occurred in Construction, representing 19% of all separations.

Mass Layoff Events by Primary Reason

Slack Work was responsible for 36% of total mass layoffs and 26% of workers separated. Contract completion accounted for 22% of all mass layoffs and 24% of all separations. Included in the 99 mass layoffs for Ohio were 11 actual establishment closures with 2,157 separations.
