

Mass Layoff Statistics 2nd Quarter 2001

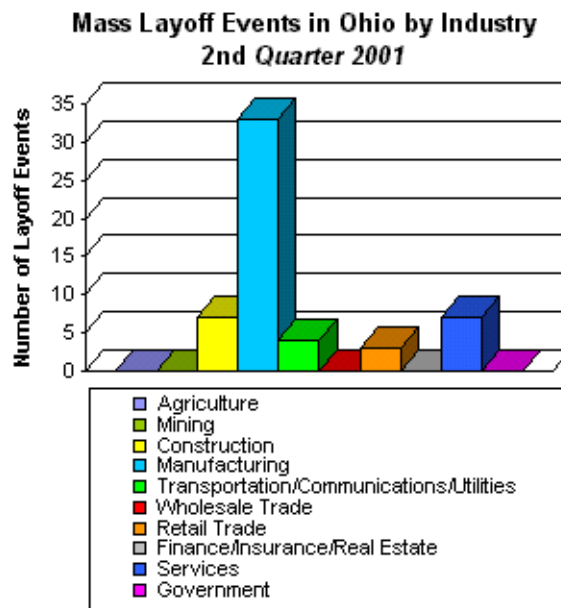
During the period April through June 2001, there were 57 mass layoff events in Ohio, a decrease of 11 events from the second quarter of 2000. This resulted in 10,114 separations, an over the year decrease of 2,479 from the second quarter 2000 total of 12,593 separations.

Mass Layoff Events by Industry

Fifty-eight percent of the total number of mass layoff events occurred in Manufacturing, representing 62% of all separations. Services accounted for 12% of all mass layoff events and 14% of all separations. Construction also reported 12% of all mass layoffs with 10% of all separations.

Mass Layoff Events by Primary Reason

Slack Work was responsible for 32% of total mass layoffs and 26% of workers separated. Events that were seasonal in nature accounted for 9% of all mass layoffs and 8% of all separations. Included in the 57 mass layoffs for Ohio were 15 actual establishment closures with 3,714 separations.
