

Mass Layoff Statistics 3rd Quarter 2001

During the period July through September 2001, there were 44 mass layoff events in Ohio, a decrease of 4 events from the Third Quarter of 2000. This resulted in 6,843 separations, an over the year decrease of 2,893 from the Third Quarter 2000 total of 9,736 separations.

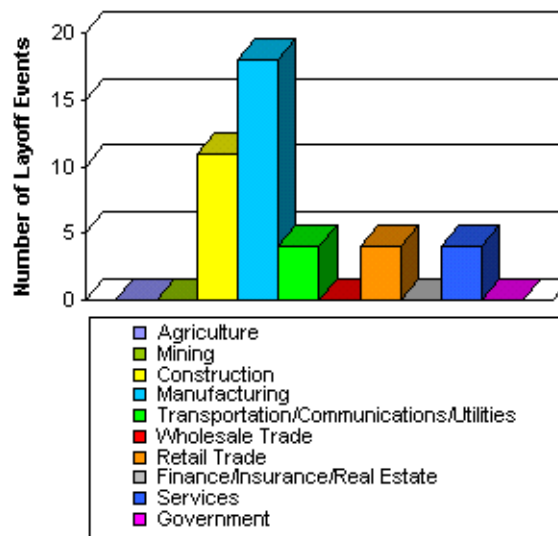
Mass Layoff Events by Industry

Forty-one percent of the total number of mass layoff events occurred in manufacturing, representing 41% of all separations. Construction accounted for 25% of all mass layoff events and 15% of all separations. Services reported 9% of all mass layoffs with 11% of all separations.

Mass Layoff Events by Primary Reason

Contracts Completed was responsible for 15% of total mass layoffs and 25% of workers separated. Slack Work accounted for 10% of all mass layoffs and 33% of all separations. Included in the 44 mass layoffs for Ohio were 10 actual establishment closures with 2,288 separations.
