

Mass Layoff Statistics 2nd Quarter 2002

During the period April through June 2002, there were 62 mass layoff events in Ohio, a increase of 5 events over the Second Quarter of 2001. This resulted in 6,789 separations, an over the year decrease of 3,325 from the Second Quarter 2001 total of 10,114 separations.

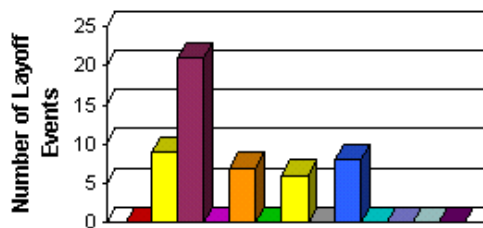
Mass Layoff Events by Industry

Thirty-four percent of the total number of mass layoff events occurred in manufacturing, representing 35% of all separations. Construction accounted for 15% of all mass layoff events and 11% of all separations. Professional and Business Services reported 13% of all mass layoffs with 14% of all separations.

Mass Layoff Events by Primary Reason

Company Reorganization was responsible for 40% of total mass layoffs and 39% of workers separated. Slack work accounted for 21% of all mass layoffs and 23% of all separations. In comparison, there were 15 closures with 1,862 separations in the 2nd quarter 2001.
