

Mass Layoff Events in Ohio

3rd Quarter 2009

During the period July through September 2009, there were 75 mass layoff events in Ohio, an increase of 26 events over the 3rd Quarter of 2008. This resulted in 12,760 separations, an increase of 2,573 from the 3rd Quarter 2008 total of 10,187 separations. Included in the 75 events were 7 establishment closures/partial closures of single or multiple worksites with 1,954 separations. This compares to 15 establishment closures and 2,414 separations for a year ago.

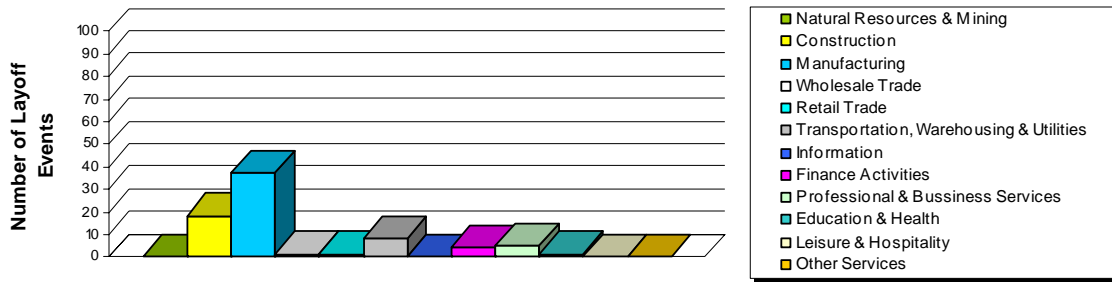
Events by Industry

Manufacturing out paced all with 49% of the total number of mass layoff events and 64% of all separations. Construction followed with 24% of the total events and represented 14% of all separations. Transportation, warehousing and utilities contributed 11% of the events and 13% of the separations.

3rd Quarter 2009



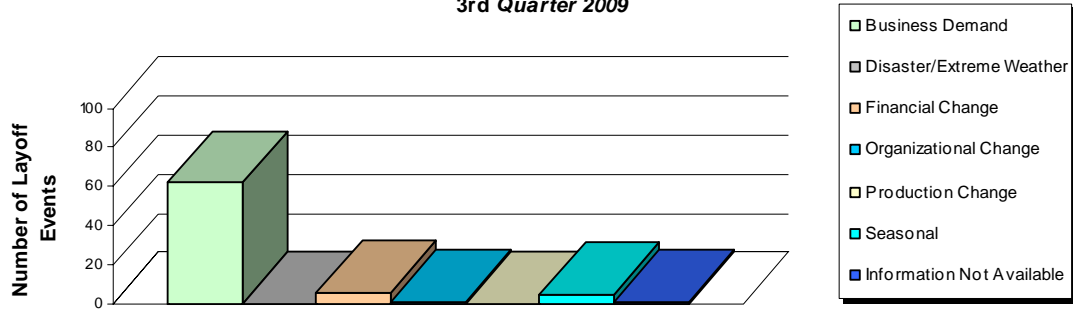
Events by Primary Reason

Business demand, which includes contract completion, excess inventory, and domestic competition, was responsible for 83% of all mass layoffs and 88% of all separations. Financial change accounted for 8% of all events and 7% of all separations. Seasonal reasons made up 7% of the layoff events and 3% of the number of workers.
