

## Mass Layoff Events in Ohio 2nd Quarter 2010

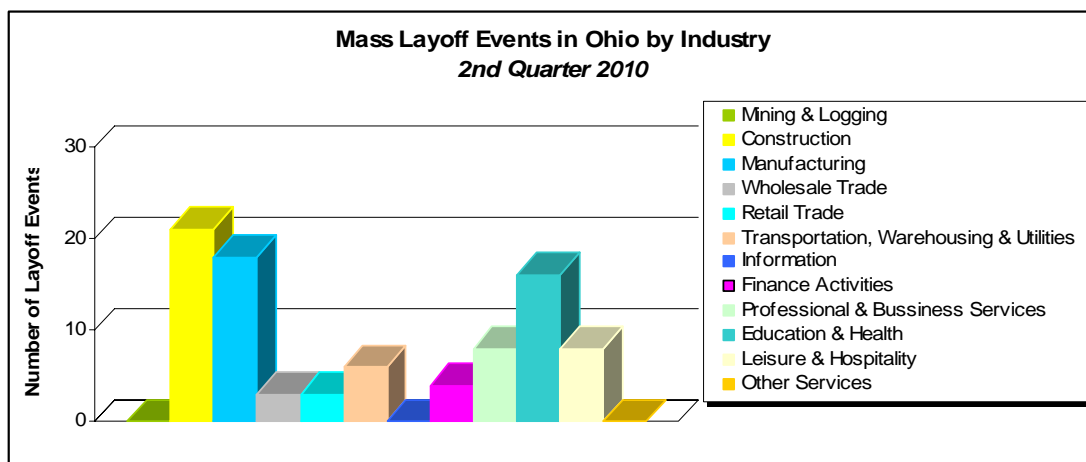
During the period April through June 2010, there were 90 mass layoff events in Ohio, a decrease of 88 events from the 2nd Quarter of 2009. This resulted in 13,011 separations, a decrease of 30,232 from the 2nd Quarter 2009 total of 43,243 separations. Included in the 90 events were 8 establishment closures/partial closures of single or multiple worksites with 825 separations. This compares to 24 establishment closures and 3,414 separations from a year ago.

### Events by Industry

Construction out paced all with 23% of the total number of mass layoff events and 19% of all separations. Manufacturing followed with 20% of the total events and represented 23% of all separations.

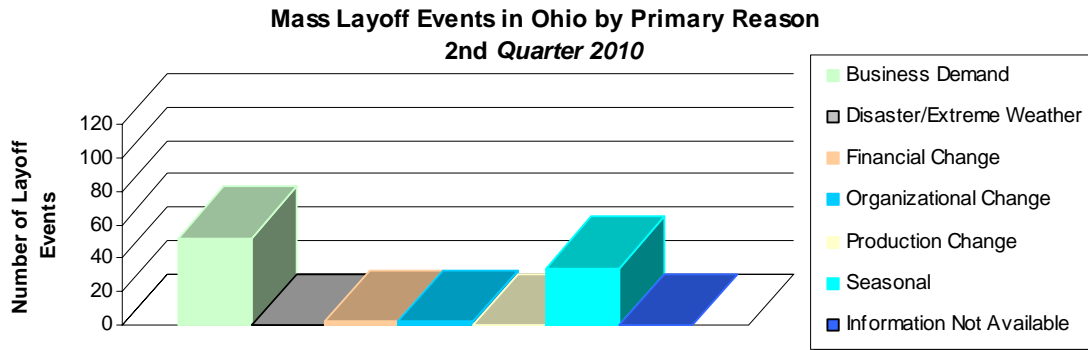


## Events by Primary Reason

Business demand was responsible for 58% of all mass layoffs and 68% of all separations. Seasonal events accounted for 38% of all mass layoffs and 29% of all separations.
