

## Mass Layoff Events in Ohio

### Second Quarter 2012

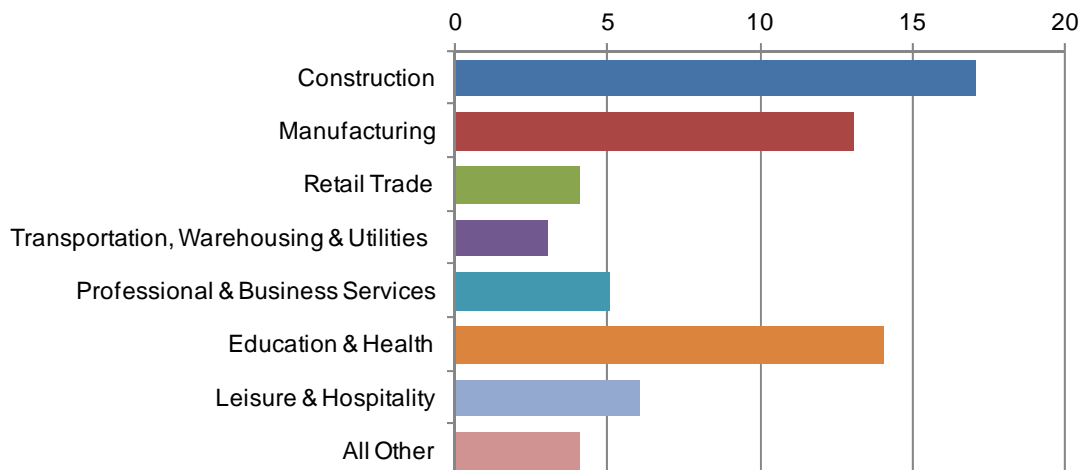
From April through June 2012, there were 66 mass layoff events in Ohio, a decrease of 13 events from the second quarter 2011. This resulted in 9,297 separations, a decrease of 1,947 from the second quarter 2011 (11,244 separations). Included in the 66 events were 5 establishment closures of single or multiple worksites with 1,073 separations. This compares to 2 establishment closures and 145 separations from a year ago.

#### Events by Industry

The construction industry outpaced all other industries with 26 percent of the mass layoff events and 24 percent of separations. Education & Health followed with 21 percent of the events and represented 18 percent of separations. Manufacturing closely followed with 20 percent of mass layoff events and 18 percent of separations during second quarter 2012.

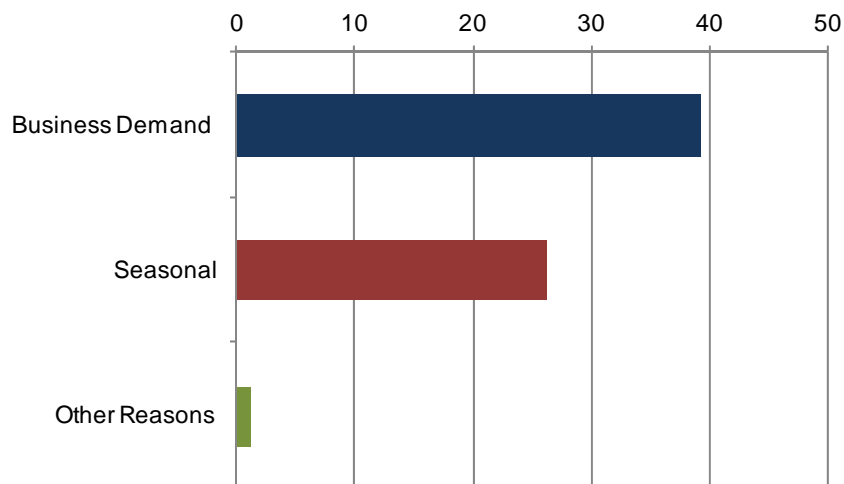

### Events by Primary Reason

Business Demand was responsible for 59 percent of mass layoffs and 60 percent of separations. Seasonal Demand accounted for 39 percent of mass layoffs and 38 percent of separations.

### Movement of Work

In the second quarter 2012 there were no instances in which the reason for layoffs corresponded to out-of-country or domestic relocations of work within the same company.
