

Mass Layoff Events in Ohio

Fourth Quarter 2012

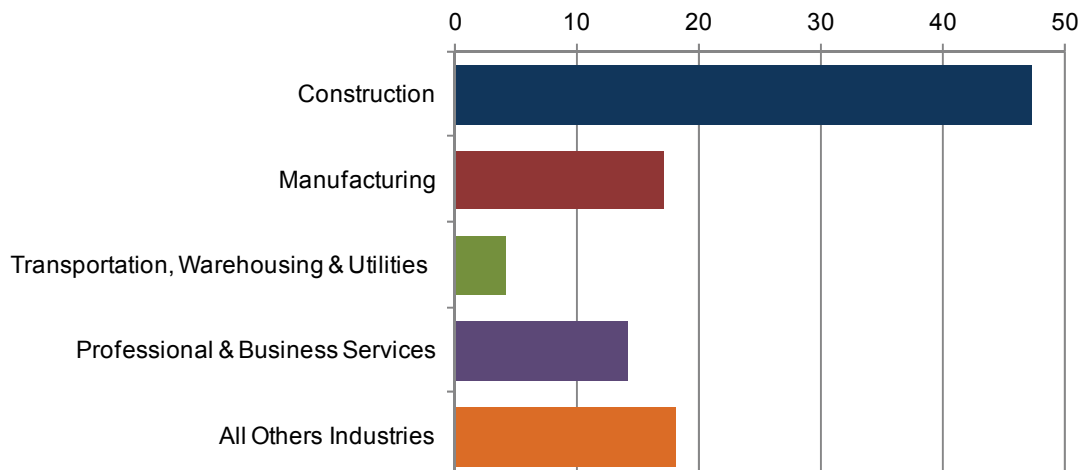
From October through December 2012, there were 100 mass layoff events in Ohio, an increase of 8 events from the fourth quarter 2011. This resulted in 15,052 separations, an increase of 1,957 from the fourth quarter 2011 (13,095 separations). Included in the 100 events were 2 establishment closures of single or multiple worksites with 998 separations. This compares to 2 establishment closures and 196 separations from a year ago.

Events by Industry

The construction industry outpaced all other industries with 47 percent of the mass layoff events and 45 percent of separations. Manufacturing followed with 17 percent of the events which represented 19 percent of separations closely followed by professional and business services with 14 percent of mass layoff events and 13 percent of all separations.

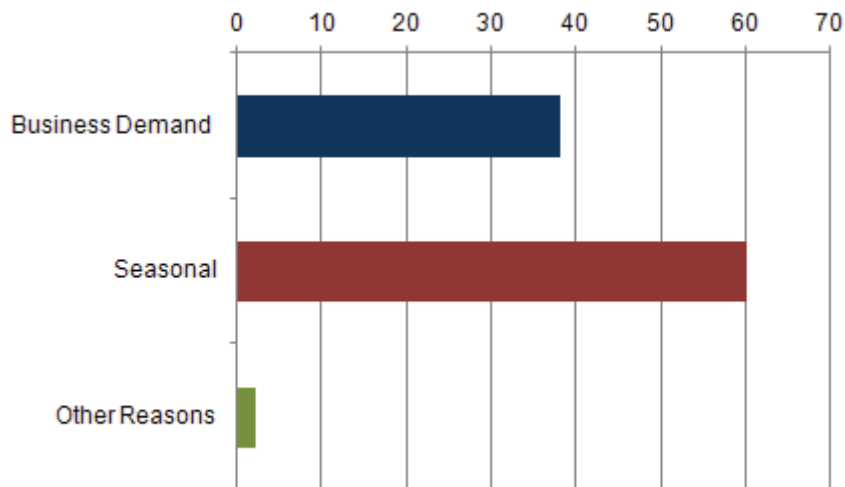


Events by Primary Reason

Seasonal Demand was responsible for 60 percent of mass layoffs and 62 percent of separations. Business Demand accounted for 38 percent of mass layoffs and 31 percent of all separations.
