




Percent of Employment in Firms

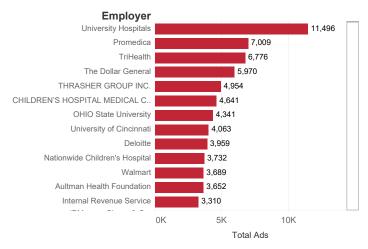


Top Occupations with the Most Area Online Job Ads

Industry Turnover Rates












Population-to-Jobs Ratio


Unemployment Claimant and Labor Force Demographics



Age Distribution


