Annual Employment Percent by Industry







Industry Turnover Rates

Turnover rates are calculated from stable employment (employment that lasted one calendar quarter with the same employer) and are an indicator of job churn. Industries with high churn will have more openings to replace workers than industries with low churn. It should be noted that this calculation does not include short-term employment that lasts less than a full quarter.


















Population-to-Jobs Ratio




Unemployment Claimant and Labor Force Demographics




