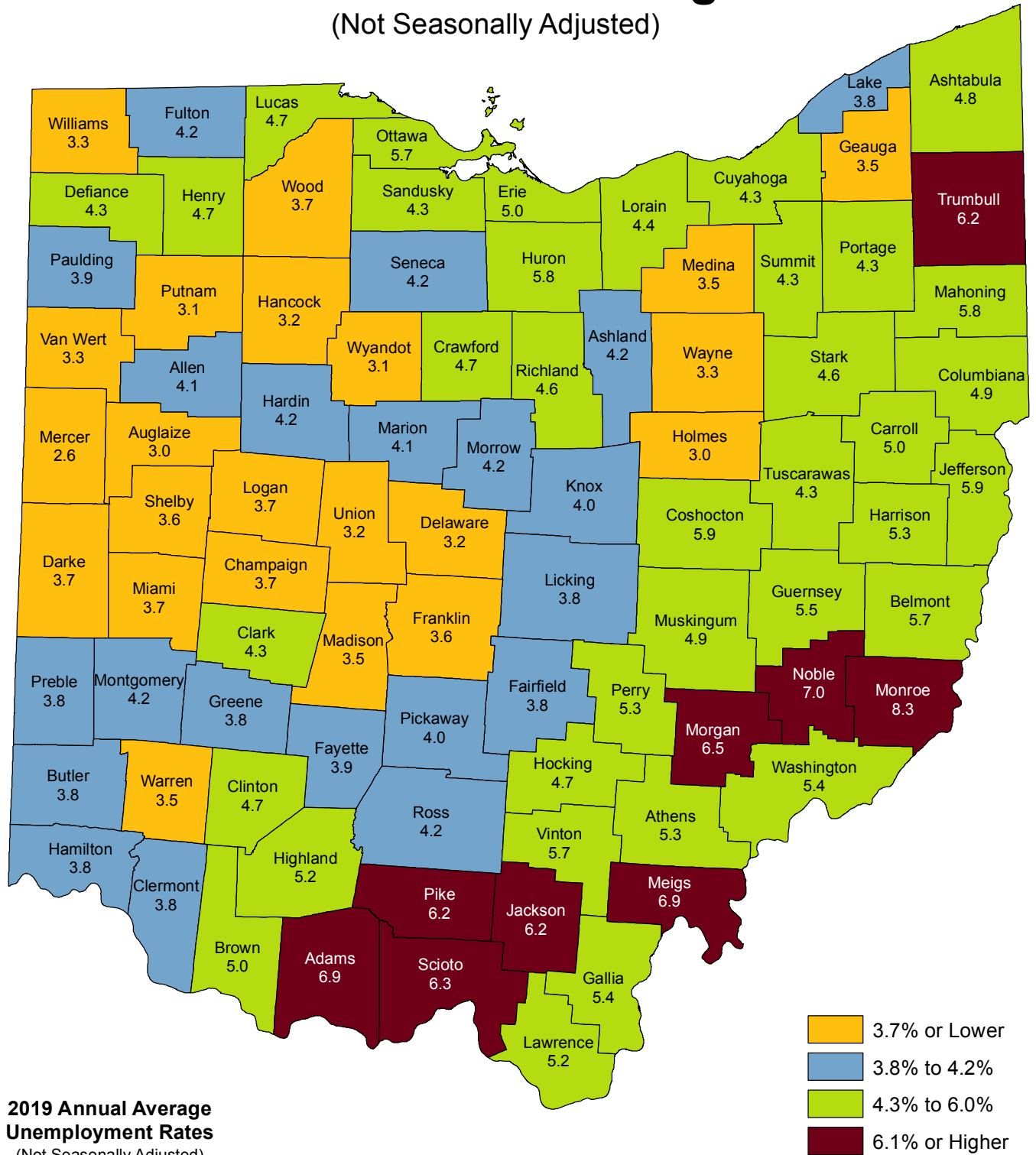


Ohio Unemployment Rates 2019 Annual Average
