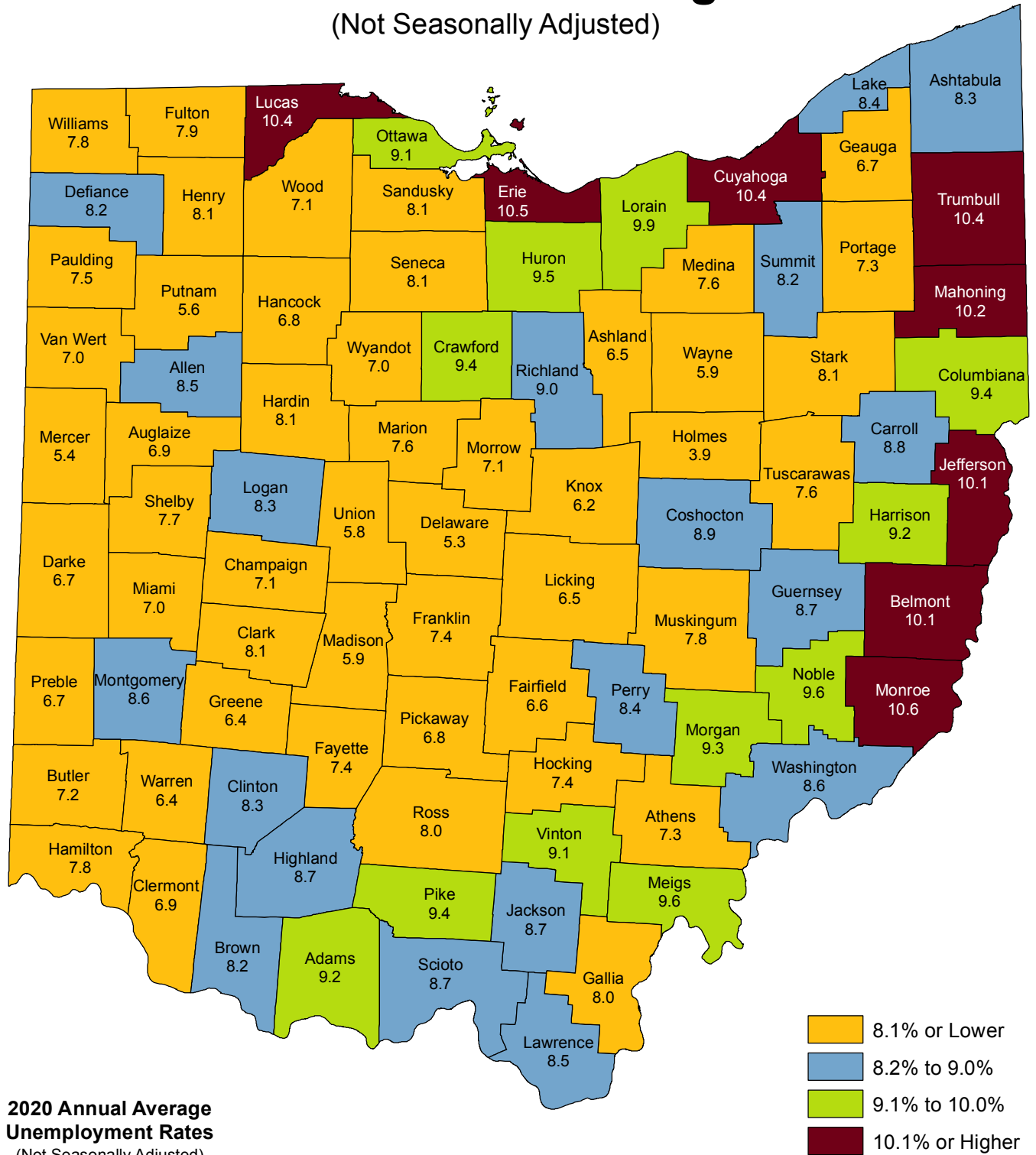


Ohio Unemployment Rates 2020 Annual Average
