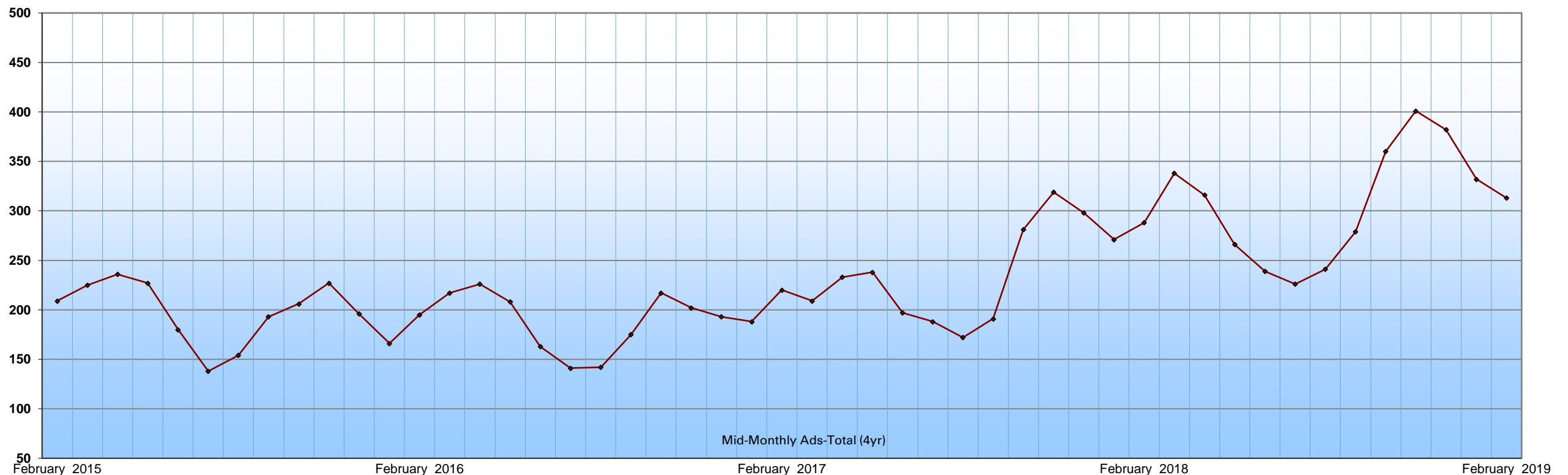


Help Wanted OnLine® Internship Ads in the Northwest JobsOhio Network

February 2019 Snapshot of Help Wanted OnLine® Internship Ads

A total of 313 internship ads were posted online from January 14, 2018, through February 13, 2019, for northwest Ohio. This was a decrease of 19 ads from the previous reporting period and an increase of 25 ads compared to the same time period a year ago. The graph below shows historical trends for internship ads posted in this area over the last several years.
