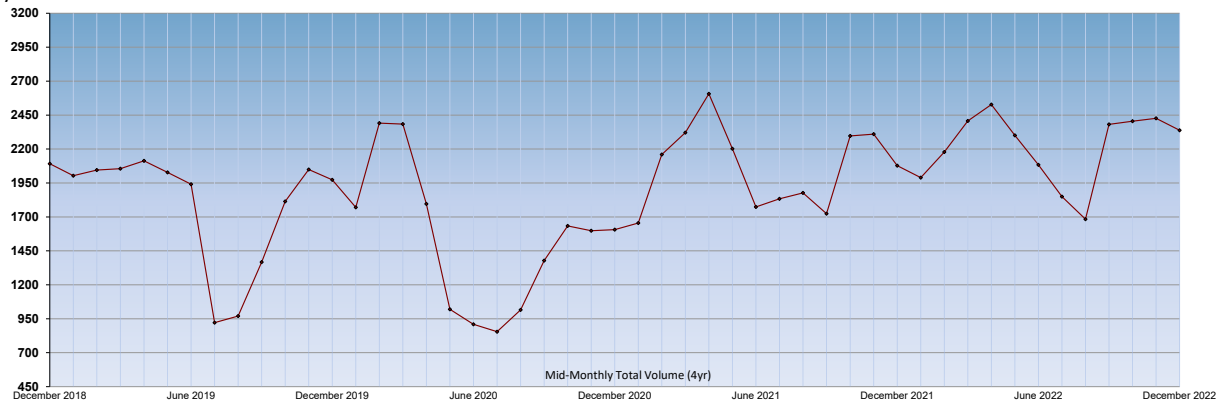


A total of 2,338 internship ads were posted online from November 14, 2022, through December 13, 2022, for northeast Ohio. This was a decrease of 88 ads from the previous reporting period and an increase of 260 ads compared to the same time period a year ago. The graph below shows historical trends for internship ads posted in this area over the last several years.

This information is a snapshot in time and may not represent long-term trends. This data has not been seasonally adjusted. Sometimes seasonal adjustment is used to remove fluctuations in unemployment and labor force trends that normally occur with changes in the season. Seasonal variation in employment occurs for natural and institutional reasons, including reduced employment involving outdoor activities during winter, changes in labor force and unemployment levels with opening and closing of schools, and layoffs during the automobile model changeover period. Seasonal variations can also affect the number of online job ads, so over the year it will affect the data in this report.
