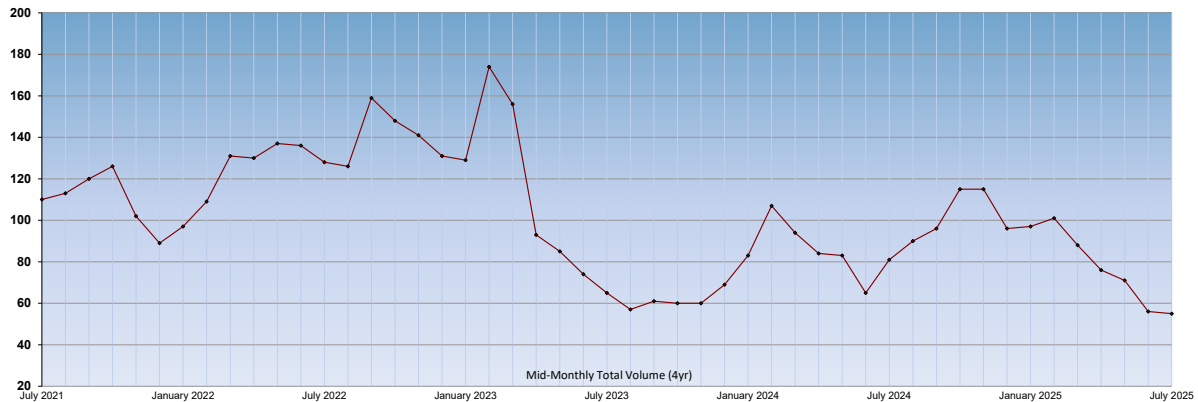


Online Internship Postings in the Eastern JobsOhio Network

A total of 55 internship ads were posted online from June 14, 2025, through July 13, 2025, for eastern Ohio. There was a decrease of one ads from the previous reporting period and a decrease of 26 ads compared to the same time period a year ago. EDITOR'S NOTE: This report is based on data provided by TalentNeuron, a global research and advisory company. Seasonal variation in employment occurs for natural and institutional reasons, including reduced employment involving outdoor activities during winter, changes in labor force and unemployment levels with opening and closing of schools, and layoffs during the automobile model changeover period. Seasonal variations can also affect the number of online job ads, so over the year it will affect the data in this report.
