## Quarterly Census of Employment & Wages

## First Quarter 2024

**Summary** - Employment covered under the Ohio Unemployment Compensation Law totaled 5.345 million in the first quarter of 2024 – up 0.9 percent from one year ago. Eleven industrial sectors experienced employment increases in the first quarter. Increases ranged from 5.6 percent in Arts, Entertainment, & Recreation to 1.4 percent in Accommodation & Food Services.

Eight private industrial sectors experienced employment declines. Decreases ranged from 6.2 percent in Administrative & Waste Services to 0.2 percent in Professional and Technical Services. State and Local Government employment increased 2.3 percent and Federal Government employment increased 4.3 percent compared to the previous year.

The first quarter 2024 payroll of \$90.7 billion was an increase of 4.8 percent from its same calendar point in 2023. Seventeen industrial sectors experienced payroll increases in the first quarter. Increases ranged from 21.7 percent in Utilities to 0.7 percent in Retail Trade. Two industrial sectors, Mining (1.9 percent) and Administrative & Waste Services (1.5 percent) experienced payroll decreases. During this same period, State & Local Government wages increased 5.1 percent. Federal Government employees showed an 8.6 percent increase in wages compared to the previous year.



Six of Ohio's largest counties experienced employment increases from their first quarter 2023 levels. Increases ranged from 2.2 percent in Stark County to 0.6 percent in Lorain County. Employment decreases occurred in four of Ohio's largest counties. Decreases ranged from 0.7 percent in Lucas County to 0.1 percent in Hamilton and Mahoning Counties.

All ten of Ohio's largest counties experienced payroll increases since 2023. Payroll increases ranged from 7.5 percent in Butler County to 2.2 percent in Lucas County.

The chart that follows presents the percentage of Ohio covered employment in each of the ten largest counties and all other counties combined. Ten of Ohio's 88 counties account for nearly 60 percent of the state's covered employment.

**Comparability with Other Data.** This quarterly data may not compare with the monthly data published in the *Labor Market Review*. Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages data are tabulated from reports of employment covered by Ohio Unemployment Compensation Law. The monthly data presented in the *Labor Market Review* are from a sample survey of employers and represent estimates of total employment in the nonagricultural wage and salary sectors.

**Further Data.** These data were compiled from quarterly reports for over 338,000 reporting units. Summary tabulations are published in preliminary form, for the first quarter of 2024, by industrial sector and county. They present average quarterly employment tabulations and first quarter payroll figures for each county in Ohio. Data for earlier periods or years and definitions of covered employment and payroll concepts are available upon request.
