Did you know that Ohio is the birthplace of seven U.S. presidents? Eight presidents actually called Ohio home. William Henry Harrison was born in Virginia but later settled near Cincinnati. It's no wonder the state is known as the "Mother of Presidents"!

23	Benjamin Harrison	1889 – 1893	North Bend, OH
25	William McKinley	1897 – 1901	Niles, OH
27	William Howard Taft	1909 – 1913	Cincinnati, OH
29	Warren Harding	1921 – 1923	Near Blooming Grove, OH

Making an Impact

- Grant signed legislation establishing the 8-hour workday for federal employees.
- Hayes signed a law to allow women lawyers to practice before the U.S. Supreme Court.
- McKinley served two two-year terms as governor of Ohio.
- Taft was the only president to also serve as Chief Justice of the U.S. Supreme Court.
- Harding had many jobs before becoming the president. He was a teacher, an insurance salesman, a reporter, and the owner of a newspaper called the Marion Daily Star.
