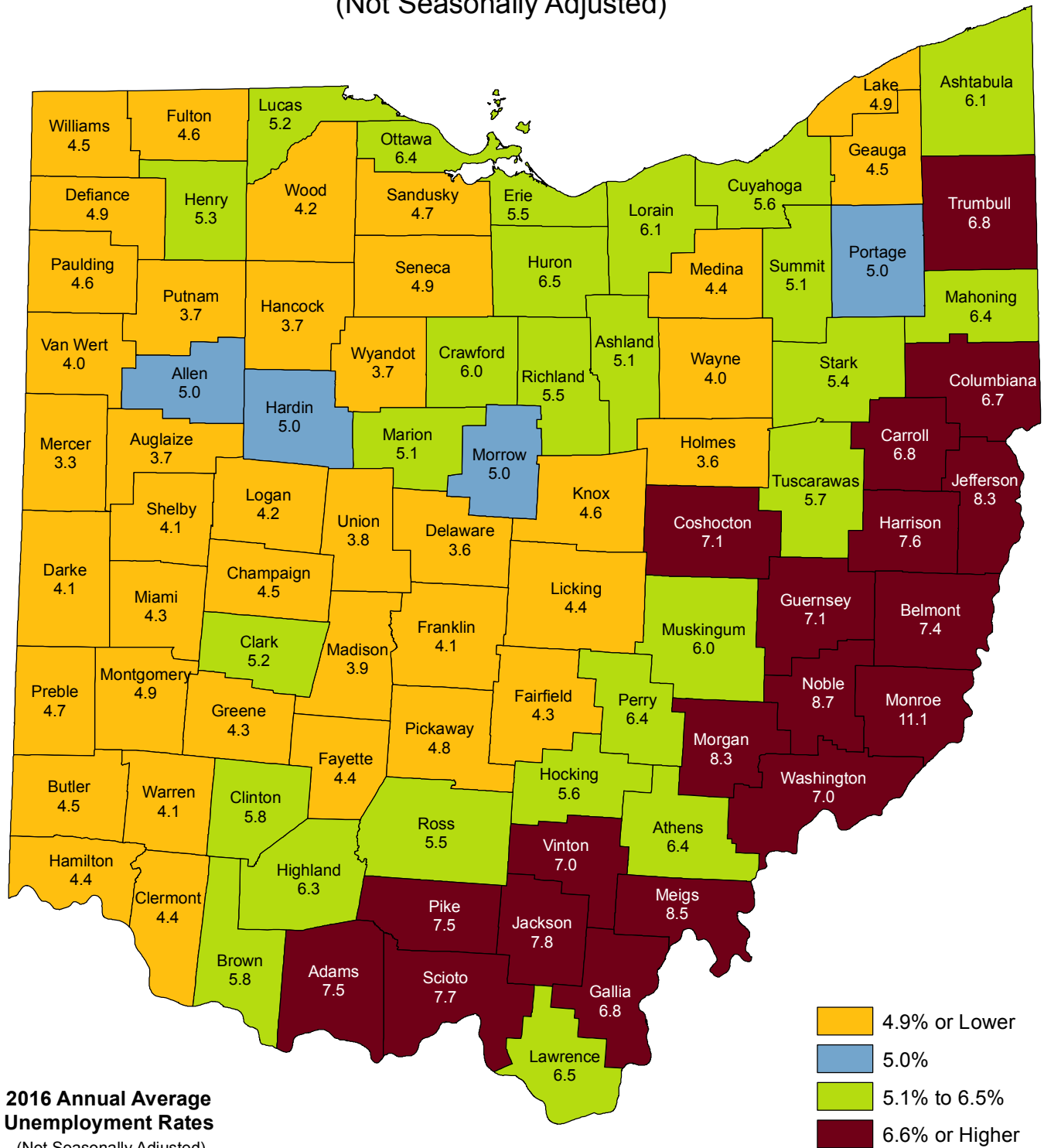


Ohio Unemployment Rates 2016 Annual Average
