



# Quarterly Census of Employment & Wages

## Third Quarter 2013

**Summary** - Employment covered under the Ohio Unemployment Compensation Law totaled 5.067 million in the third quarter of 2013 – up 1.5 percent from one year ago. Fifteen industrial sectors experienced employment increases in the third quarter. Increases in total employment ranged from 6.0 percent in Arts, entertainment, & recreation to 0.7 in Manufacturing.

Four private industrial sectors experienced an employment decline. Decreases in these sectors ranged from 2.7 percent in Educational services to 1.0 percent in both Mining and Utilities. State & local government employment increased by 0.3 percent and Federal employment decreased 2.4 percent since 2012.

The third quarter 2013 payroll of \$54.555 billion was an increase of 2.7 percent from its same calendar point in 2012. Fifteen industrial sectors experienced payroll increases in the third quarter. Increases in total wages ranged from 6.8 percent in Agriculture, forestry, fishing & hunting to 1.1 in Manufacturing. Four sectors experienced a payroll decline since last year. Decreases ranged from 5.2 percent in Mining to 0.8 percent in Management of companies & enterprises. During this same period, State & local government wages increased 0.9 percent while Federal employees experienced a 3.5 percent decline.

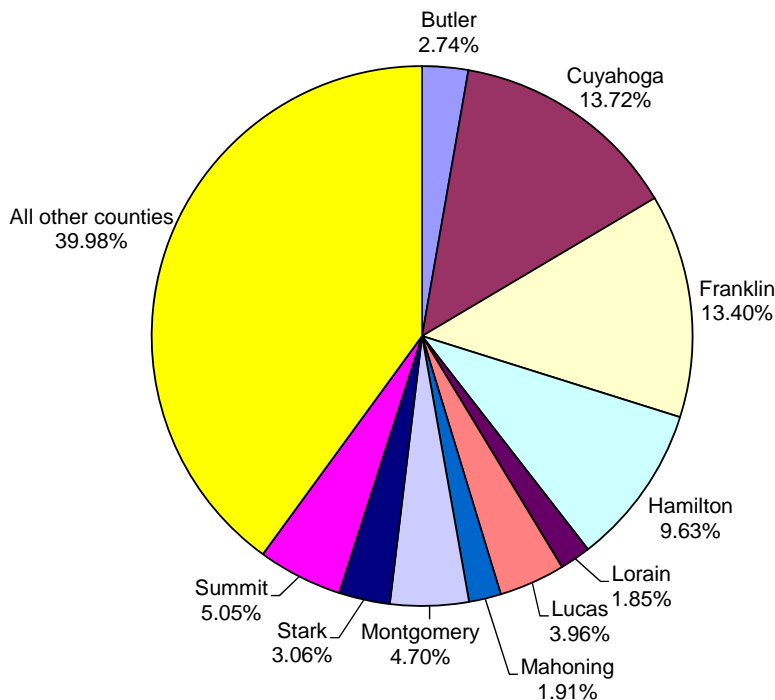
Nine of Ohio's ten largest counties experienced employment increases from their third quarter 2012 levels. Increases ranged from 3.3 percent in Franklin County to 0.5 percent in Lucas County. Montgomery County was the only county to show a decline, down 0.3 percent from one year ago.

Nine of the ten largest counties experienced payroll increases since 2012. Payroll gains ranged from 4.5 percent in both Franklin and Stark County to 0.2 percent in Butler County. Hamilton County experienced the only payroll decrease in the third quarter of 2013, down 0.4 percent.

The chart that follows presents the percentage of Ohio covered employment in each of the ten largest counties and all other counties combined. Ten of Ohio's 88 counties account for more than 60 percent of the state's covered employment.

**Comparability with Other Data.** This quarterly data may not compare with the monthly data published in the *Labor Market Review*. Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages data are tabulated from reports of employment covered by Ohio Unemployment Compensation Law. The monthly data presented in the *Labor Market Review* are from a sample survey of employers and represent estimates of total employment in the nonagricultural wage and salary sectors.

**Further Data.** These data were compiled from quarterly reports for over 288,000 reporting units. Summary tabulations are published in preliminary form, for the third quarter of 2013, by industrial sector and county. They present average quarterly employment tabulations and second quarter payroll figures for each county in Ohio. Data for earlier periods or years and definitions of covered employment and payroll concepts are available upon request.
