Advanced Manufacturing Industry SNAPSHOT

- In 2019 the advanced manufacturing industry cluster's average annual pay was \$63,705¹. During this same time period, Ohio's statewide private industry average annual wage was \$51,726.
- The advanced manufacturing industry is expected to provide <u>25,386</u> average annual job opportunities across all occupations within the cluster.
