

2016-2026 Ohio Employment Projections

Energy and Chemicals Industry SNAPSHOT

- In 2017, the energy and chemicals industry cluster’s average annual pay was **\$85,379¹**. During this same time period, Ohio’s statewide private industry average annual wage was \$48,577.
- The energy and chemicals industry is expected to provide **8,036** average annual job opportunities across all occupations within the cluster.
