

## Comparison of Covered Employment for the City of Cleveland and Cuyahoga County First Quarter 2005

The Ohio Bureau of Labor Market Information, in cooperation with the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS), geocoded covered employment and wage data for the City of Cleveland and Cuyahoga County. First quarter 2005 data from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW) program was used. A geocodable record contains a physical location address that can be assigned a longitude, latitude, and place code.

A table was published presenting first quarter 2005 employment and wage data for establishments identified as being in the City of Cleveland (place code = 16000). The geocoded data were further evaluated and maps were produced to show private ownership employment levels for each ZIP code in the City of Cleveland and Cuyahoga County. Three industrial sectors were selected for mapping at the ZIP code level: Manufacturing; Retail Trade; and Professional and Technical Services. It should be noted that the ZIP codes plotted on the City of Cleveland maps were those with employment assigned the place code 16000 by the geocoding software. Also, due to mapping software limitations, some ZIP codes were combined. Any boundary changes on the current maps, as compared to previously published maps, are attributed to a mapping software update, not an actual boundary change.

The number of private sector establishments and average employment for both the City of Cleveland and Cuyahoga County are presented in the table below. Overall, the City of Cleveland accounts for 33.7 percent of the private sector employment in Cuyahoga County.

The Manufacturing Sector comprises establishments engaged in the mechanical, physical, or chemical transformation of materials, substances, or components into new products. For the first quarter of 2005, the City of Cleveland had 996 Manufacturing establishments with an average monthly employment of 27,277. This represents 12.7% of all privately owned City employment. Manufacturing employment in Cuyahoga County is 13.5%, with 31.6% of it located within the City of Cleveland.

The Retail Trade Sector comprises establishments engaged in retailing merchandise, generally without transformation, and rendering services incidental to the sale of merchandise. For the City of Cleveland, 1,079 Retail Trade establishments with an average monthly employment of 12,377 were geocoded. That accounts for 5.8% of the City's employment.

Cuyahoga County employment is 11.0% Retail Trade, with 17.6% of it located within the City.

The Professional and Technical Services Sector comprises establishments that specialize in performing professional, scientific, and technical activities for others. These activities require a high degree of expertise and training. The establishments in this sector specialize according to expertise and provide these services to clients in a variety of industries. The City of Cleveland has 1,106 establishments engaged in Professional and Technical Services, with an average monthly employment of 18,443. While 8.6% of City employment is in this Sector, only 6.9% of Cuyahoga County employment is in this industry, with 41.8% of it within the City.

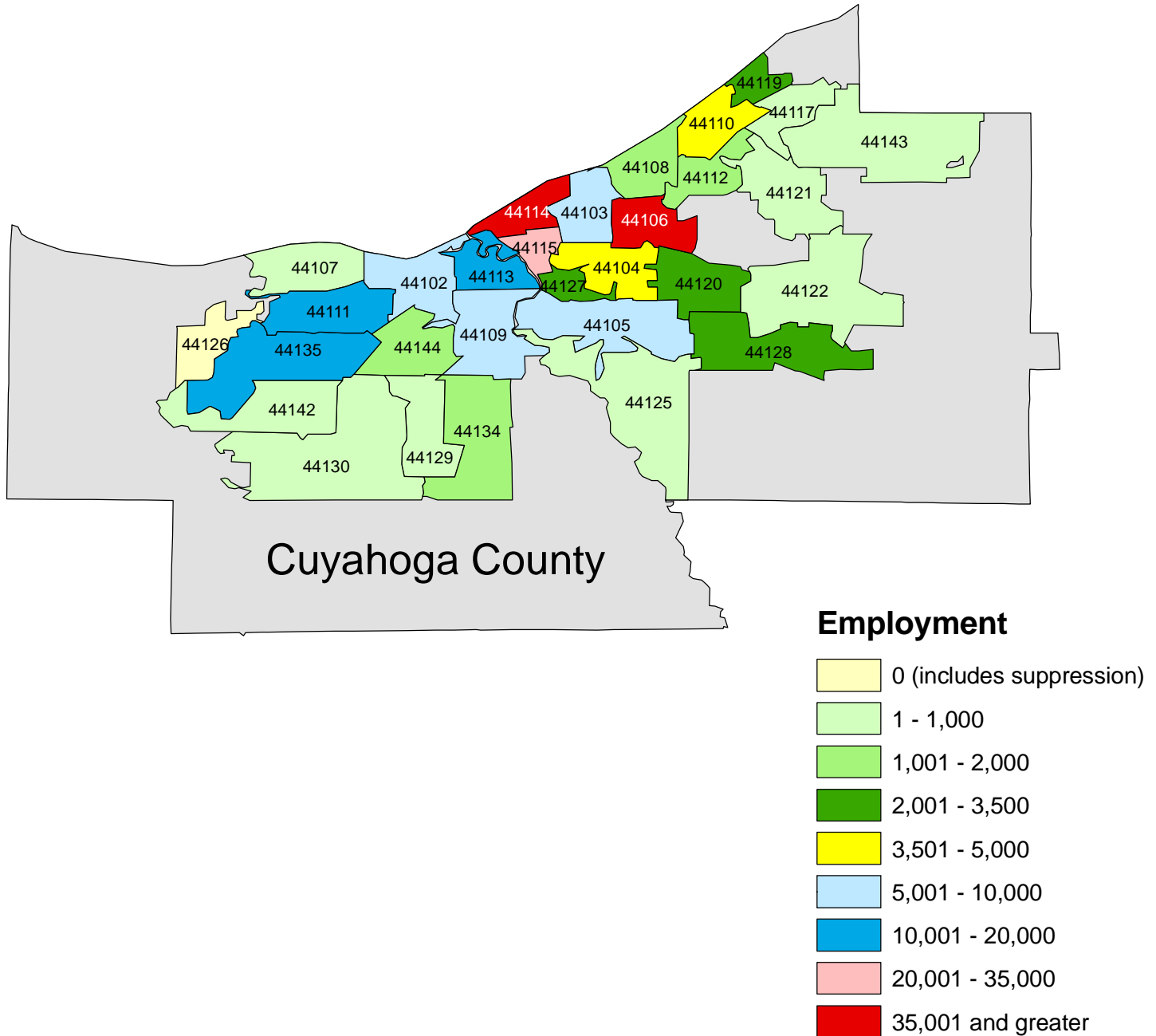

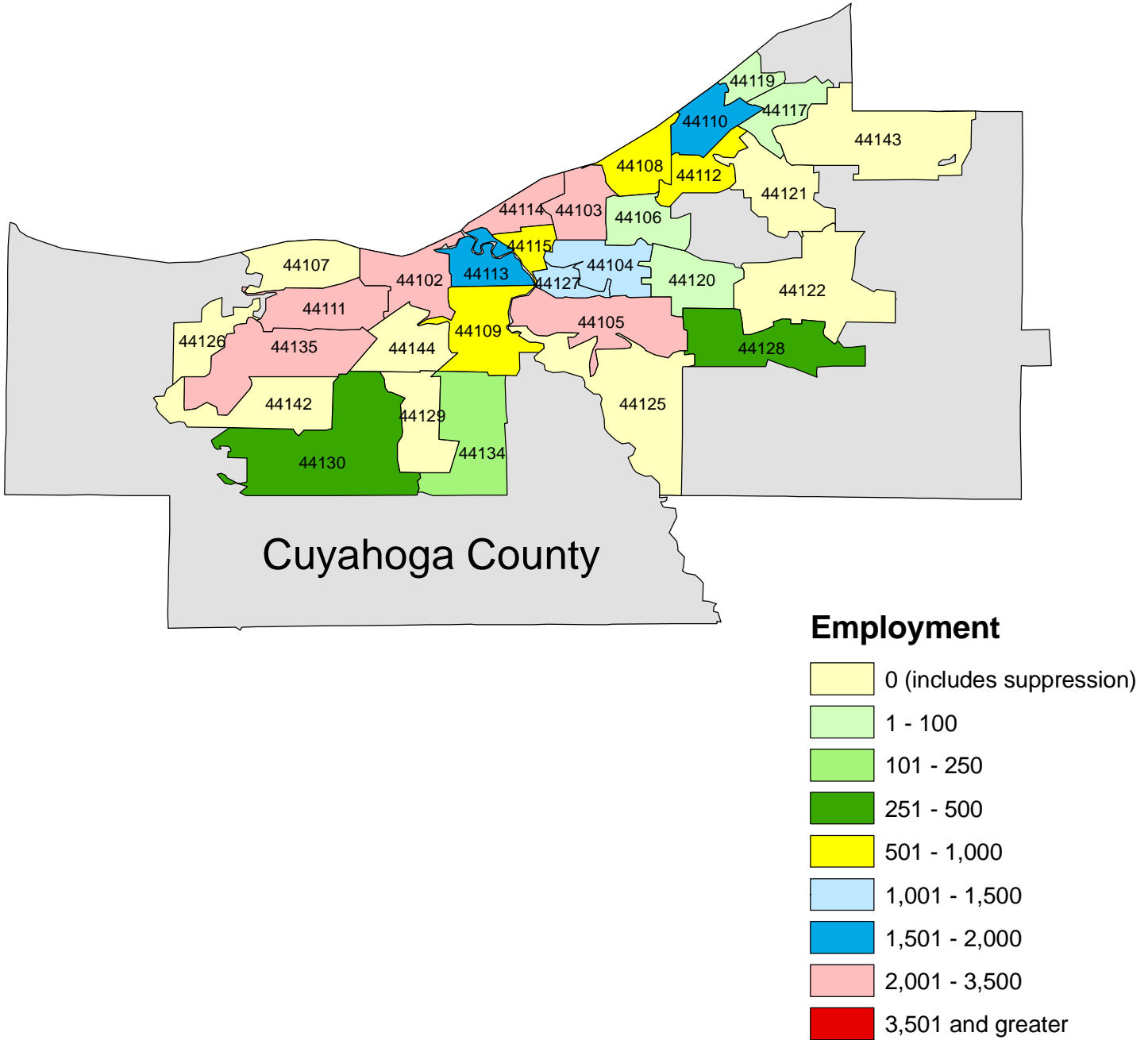

A geocodable record contains a physical location address that can be assigned a longitude, latitude and place code. Data for other cities will be published as geocodable information becomes available. (b) Summed totals and subtotals may not equal the sum of industrial divisions because of the exclusion of those industries with fewer than three employers or because of rounding. Includes the Private Sector and State Government entities, but excludes Federal Government agencies. (c) Effective first quarter 2004, local government school district information is collected at the worksite level. (d) Includes only Federal Government agencies.

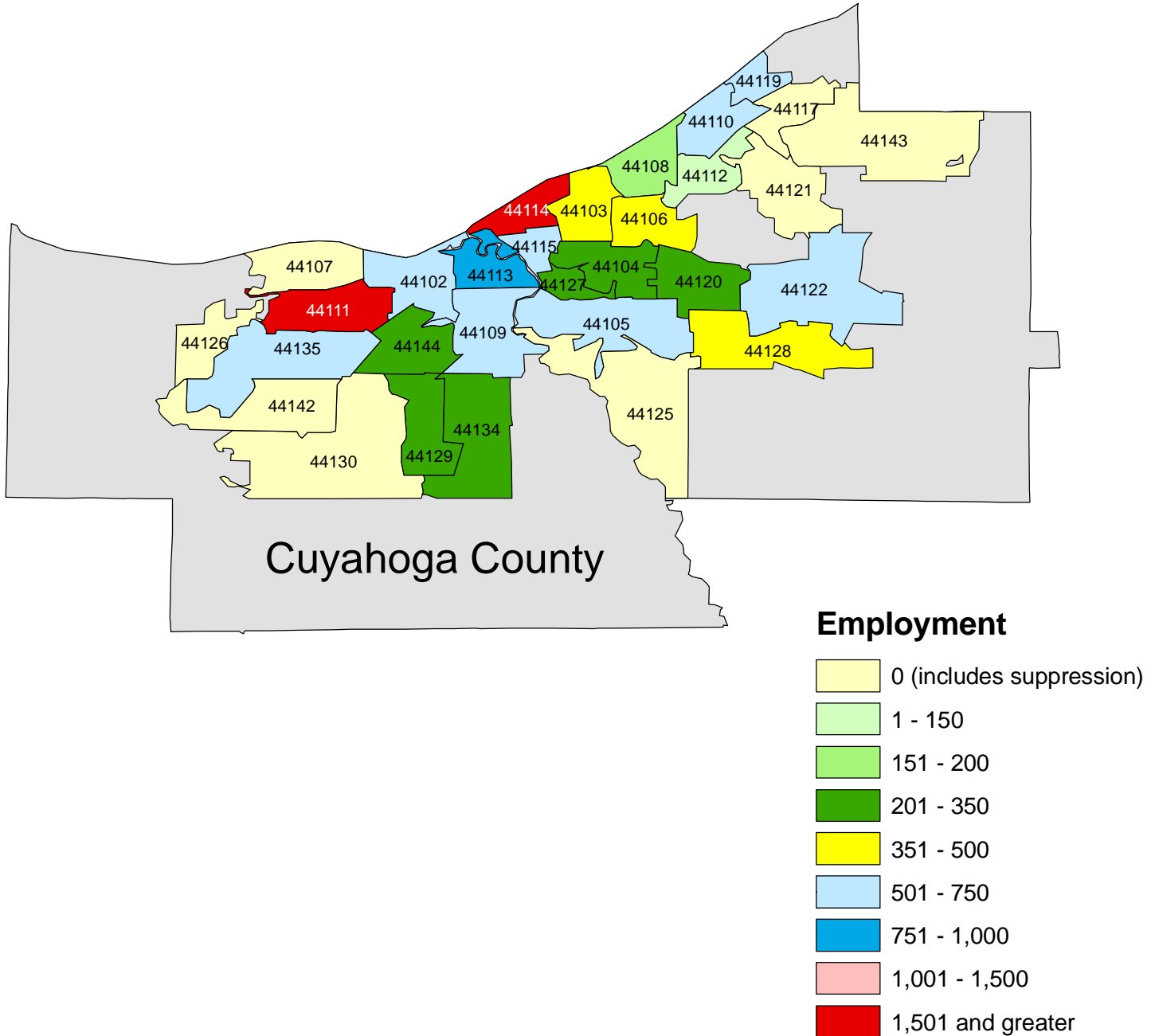
# Cleveland City Private Covered Employment by ZIP Code, 1st Quarter 2005



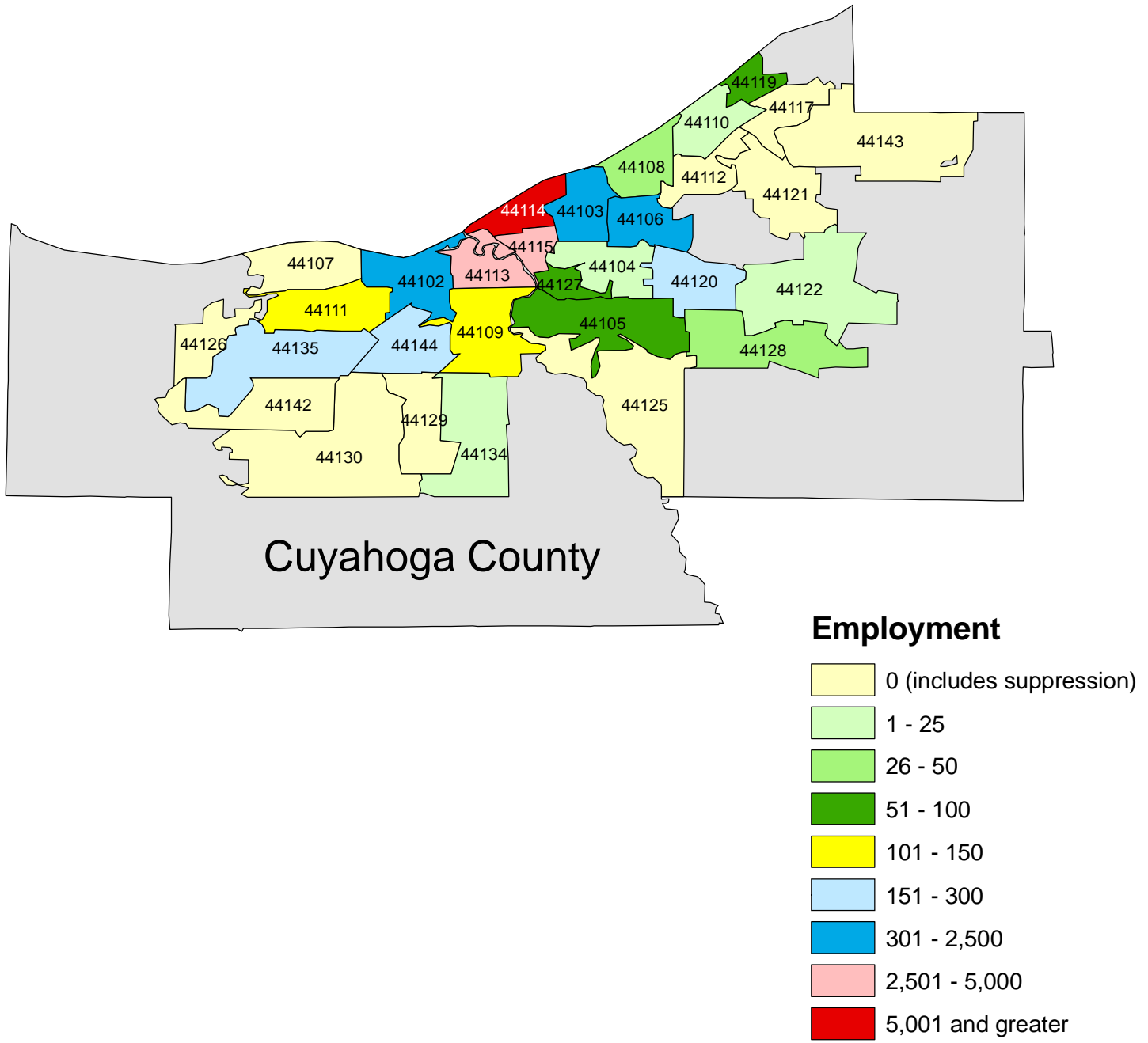
# Cleveland City NAICS Sector 31-33 Manufacturing Employment by ZIP Code, 1st Quarter 2005



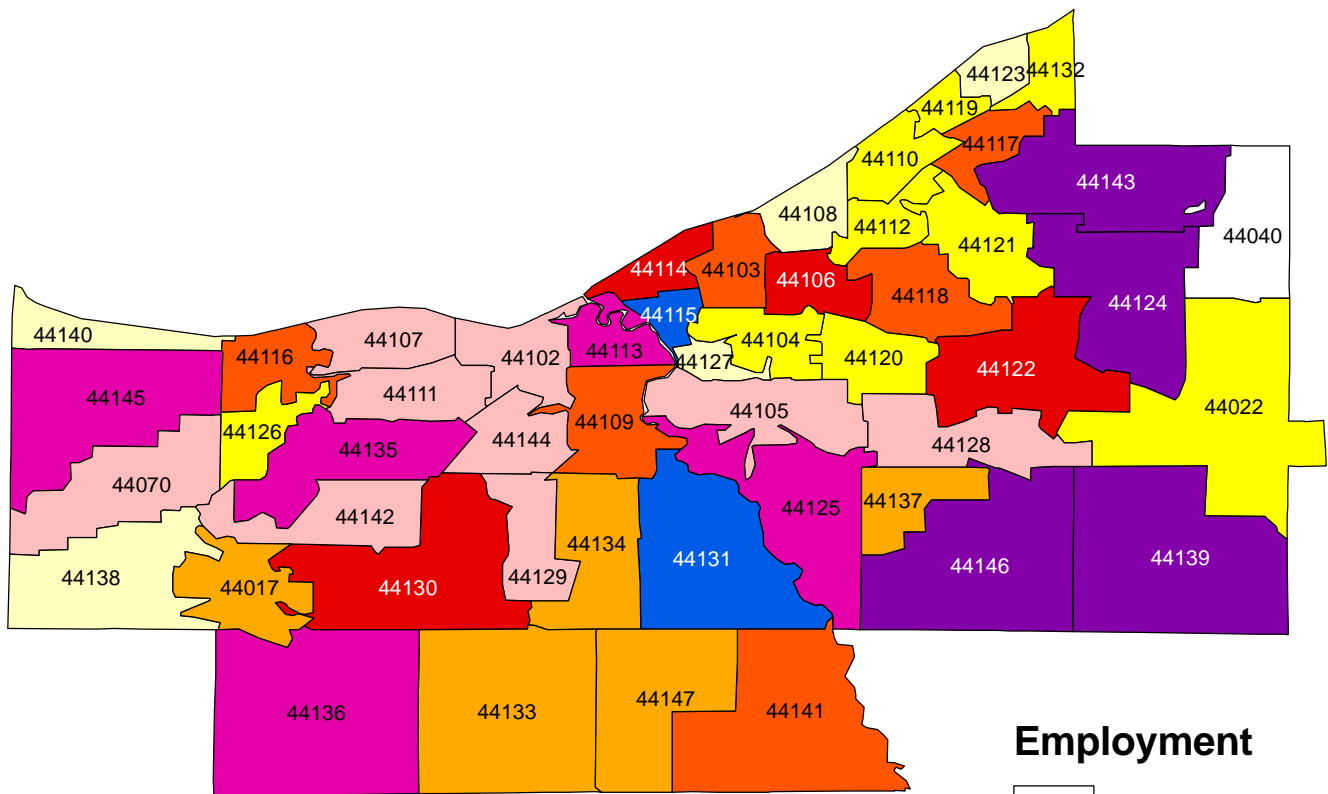
# Cleveland City NAICS Sector 44-45 Retail Trade Employment by ZIP Code, 1st Quarter 2005



# Cleveland City NAICS Sector 54 Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services Employment by ZIP Code, 1st Quarter 2005

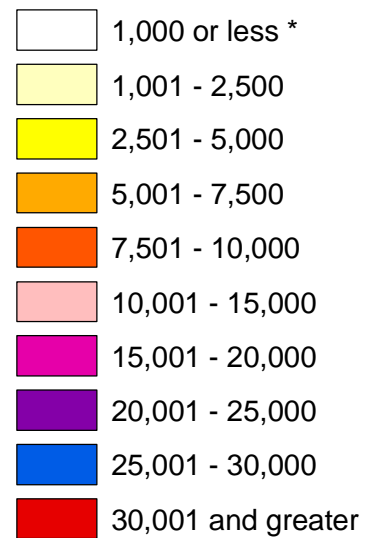


# Cuyahoga County Private Covered Employment by ZIP Code, 1st Quarter 2005

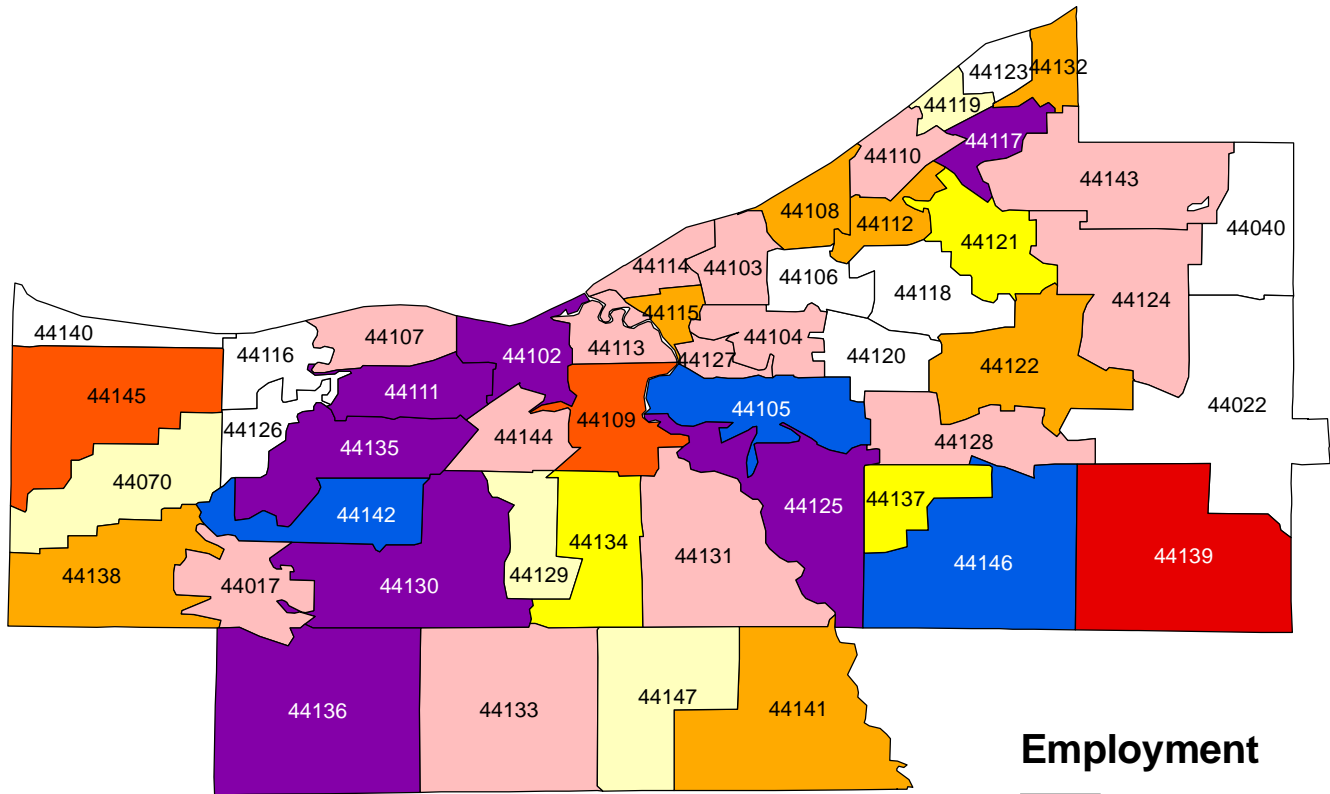

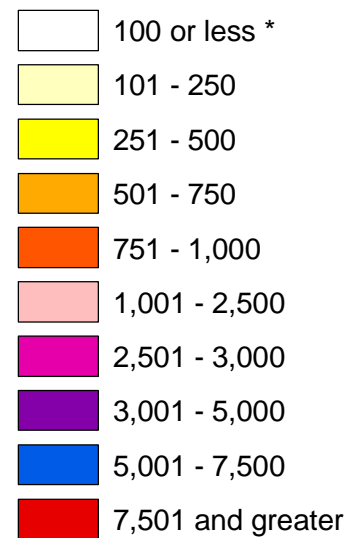


# Cuyahoga County NAICS Sector 31-33, Manufacturing Employment by ZIP Code, 1st Quarter 2005



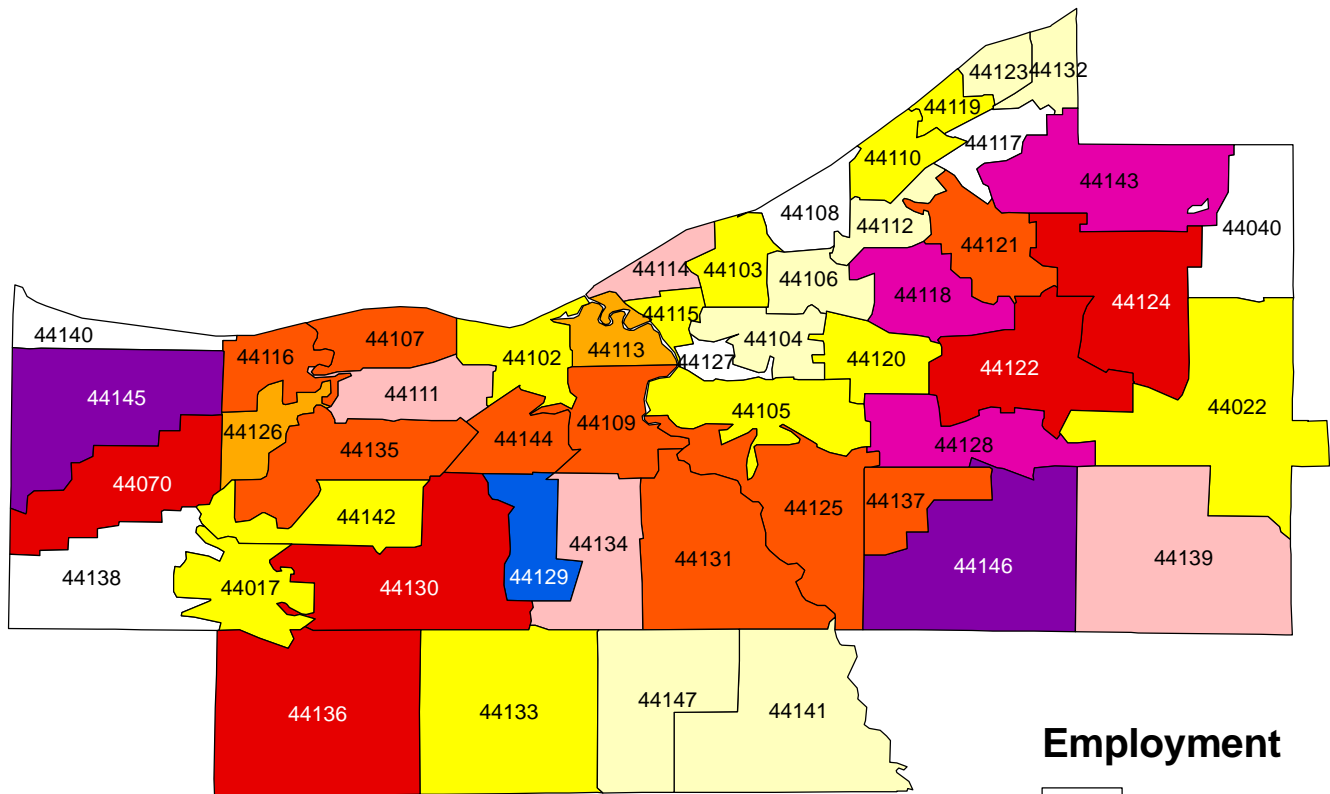

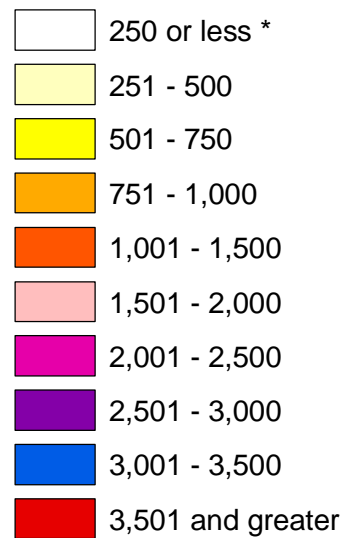

# Cuyahoga County NAICS Sector 44-45, Retail Trade Employment by ZIP Code, 1st Quarter 2005



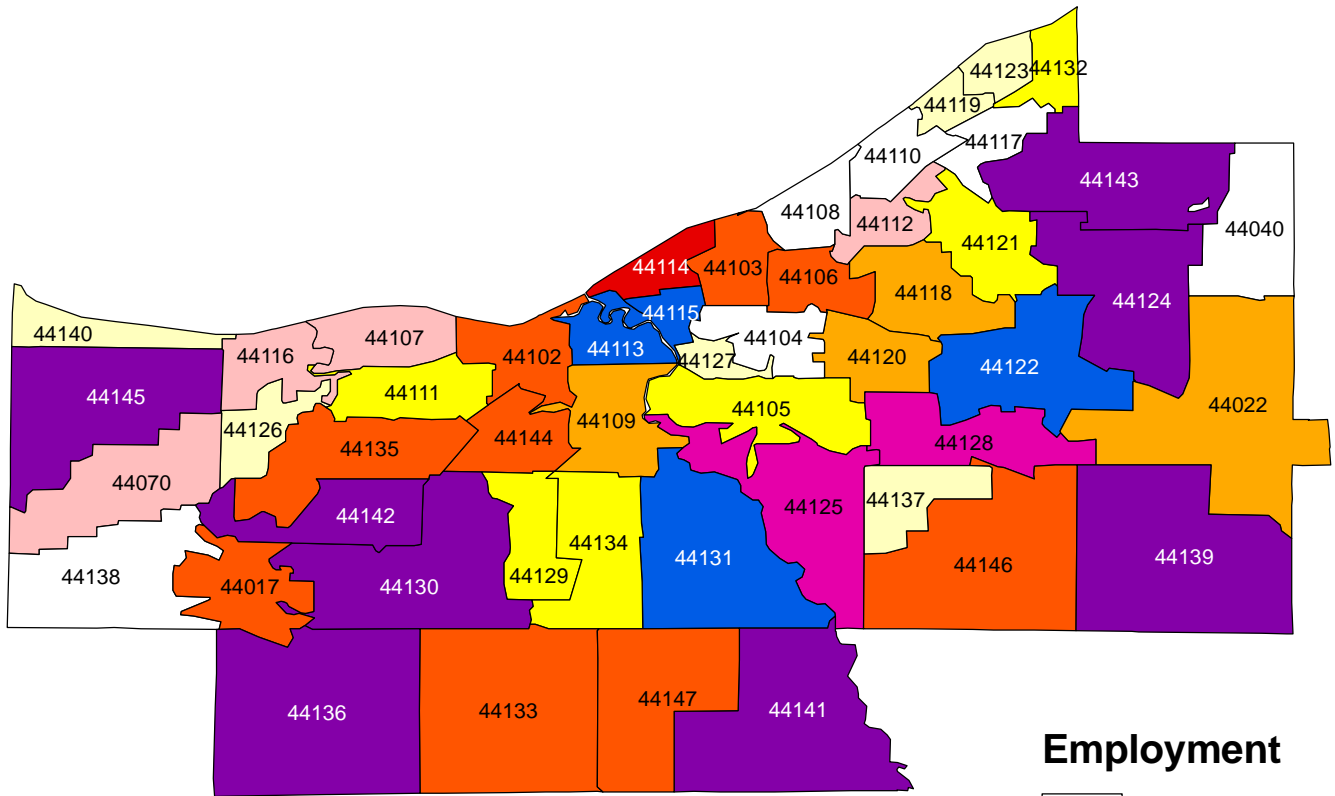

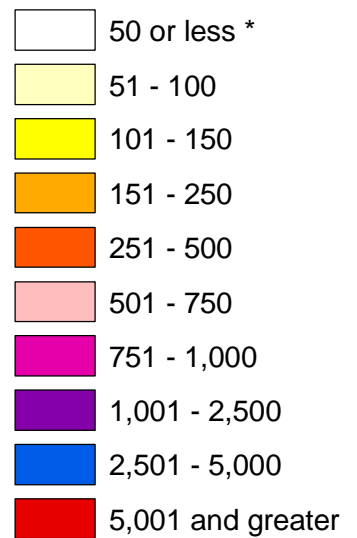
