

CITY OF COLUMBUS
QUARTERLY CENSUS OF EMPLOYMENT AND WAGES
First Quarter 2006

The Ohio Bureau of Labor Market Information, in cooperation with the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS), geocoded covered employment and wage data for the City of Columbus. First quarter 2006 data from the Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages (QCEW) program were used. A geocodable record contains a physical location address that can be assigned a longitude, latitude, and place code.

The following table presents first quarter 2006 employment and wage data for establishments identified as being in the City of Columbus (place code = 18000). The geocoded data were further evaluated and maps were produced to show private ownership employment levels for each ZIP code in the City of Columbus. Four industrial sectors were selected for mapping at the ZIP code level: Manufacturing; Retail Trade; Finance and Insurance; and Professional and Technical Services. The City of Columbus is primarily located within Franklin County, but portions of the city extend into Delaware and Fairfield Counties.

The number of private sector establishments and average employment for both the City of Columbus and Franklin County are presented in the table below.

Number of Establishments

The City of Columbus consisted of 15,386 workplace establishments covered under Ohio and Federal Unemployment Compensation Laws, of which 97.2 percent were in the private sector while 2.8 percent were government work sites. (Government establishments were comprised of federal, state, and local employers.) The Retail Trade sector depicted the largest number of establishments with 2,129, followed closely by the Professional and Technical Services sector with 1,932 establishments.

Average Monthly Employment

The average monthly employment in the City of Columbus was 448,667. Private sector employment constituted 81.2 percent of employment while all levels of government employment totaled 18.8 percent. Health Care and Social Assistance had the highest average monthly employment of any industry sector with 53,705 employees. Retail Trade and State Government followed with 48,711 and 47,964 employees, respectively.

Wages

Total wages for the first quarter of 2006 reached \$5.09 billion. The three private industry sectors with the highest total payroll were: Finance and Insurance, Professional and Technical Services, and Health Care and Social Assistance which together accounted for 32.0 percent of total wages. State, local, and federal government employment accounted for 18.1 percent of total wages in the City of Columbus.

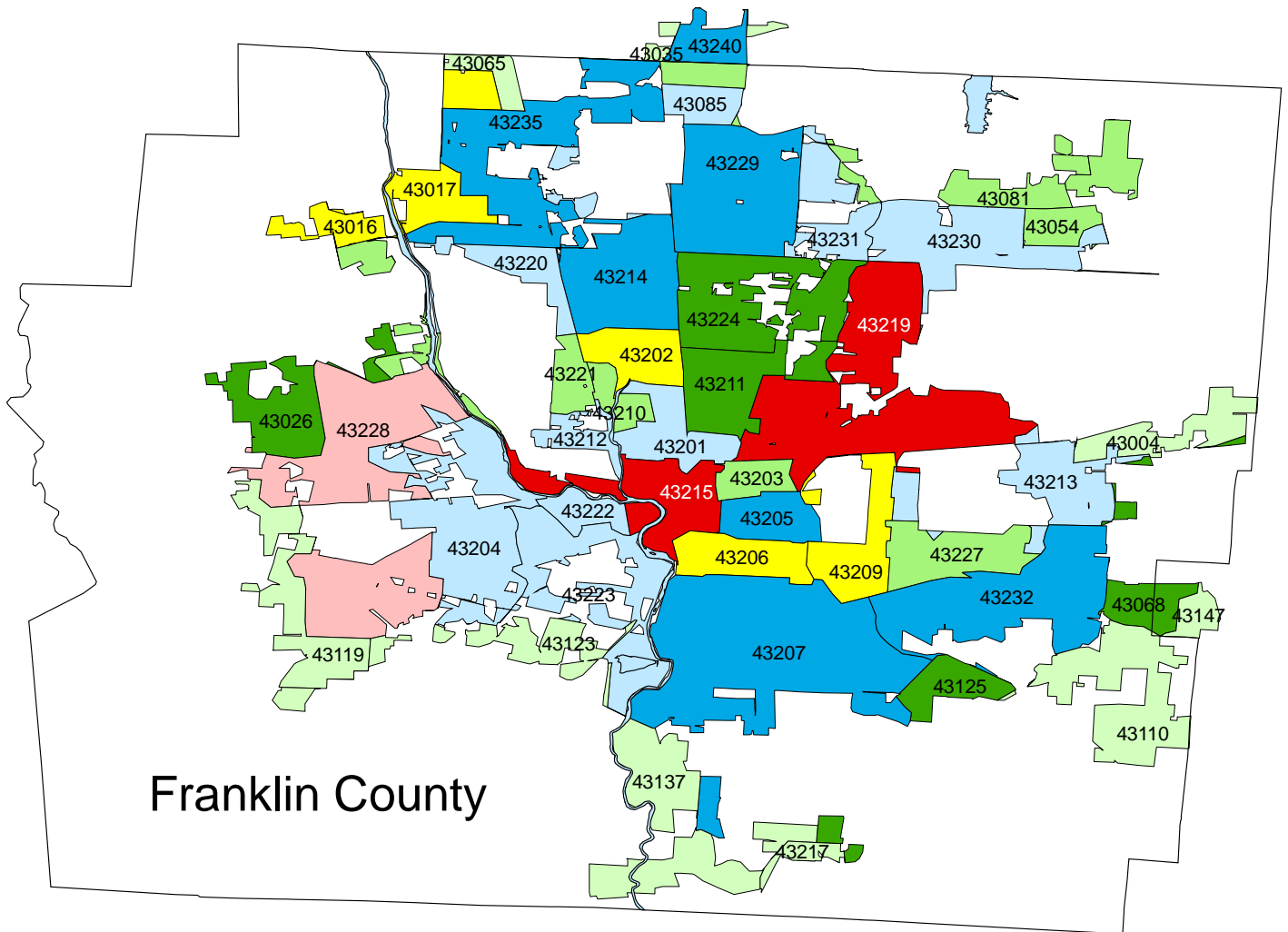

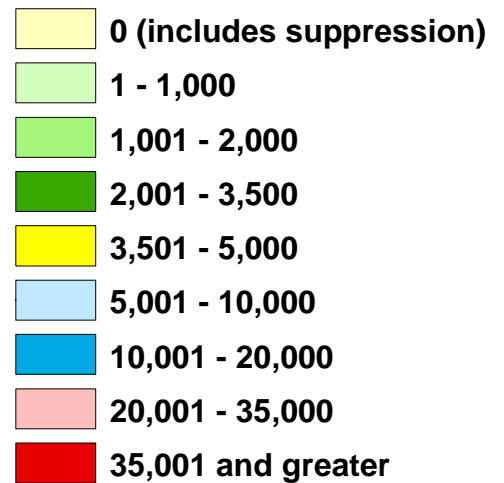

A geocodable record contains a physical location address that can be assigned a longitude, latitude and place code. Data for other cities will be published as geocodable information becomes available. (b) Summed totals and subtotals may not equal the sum of industrial divisions because of the exclusion of those industries with fewer than three employers or because of rounding. Includes the Private Sector and State Government entities, but excludes Federal Government agencies. (c) Includes only Federal Government agencies.

Columbus City Private Covered Employment by ZIP Code, 1st Quarter 2006

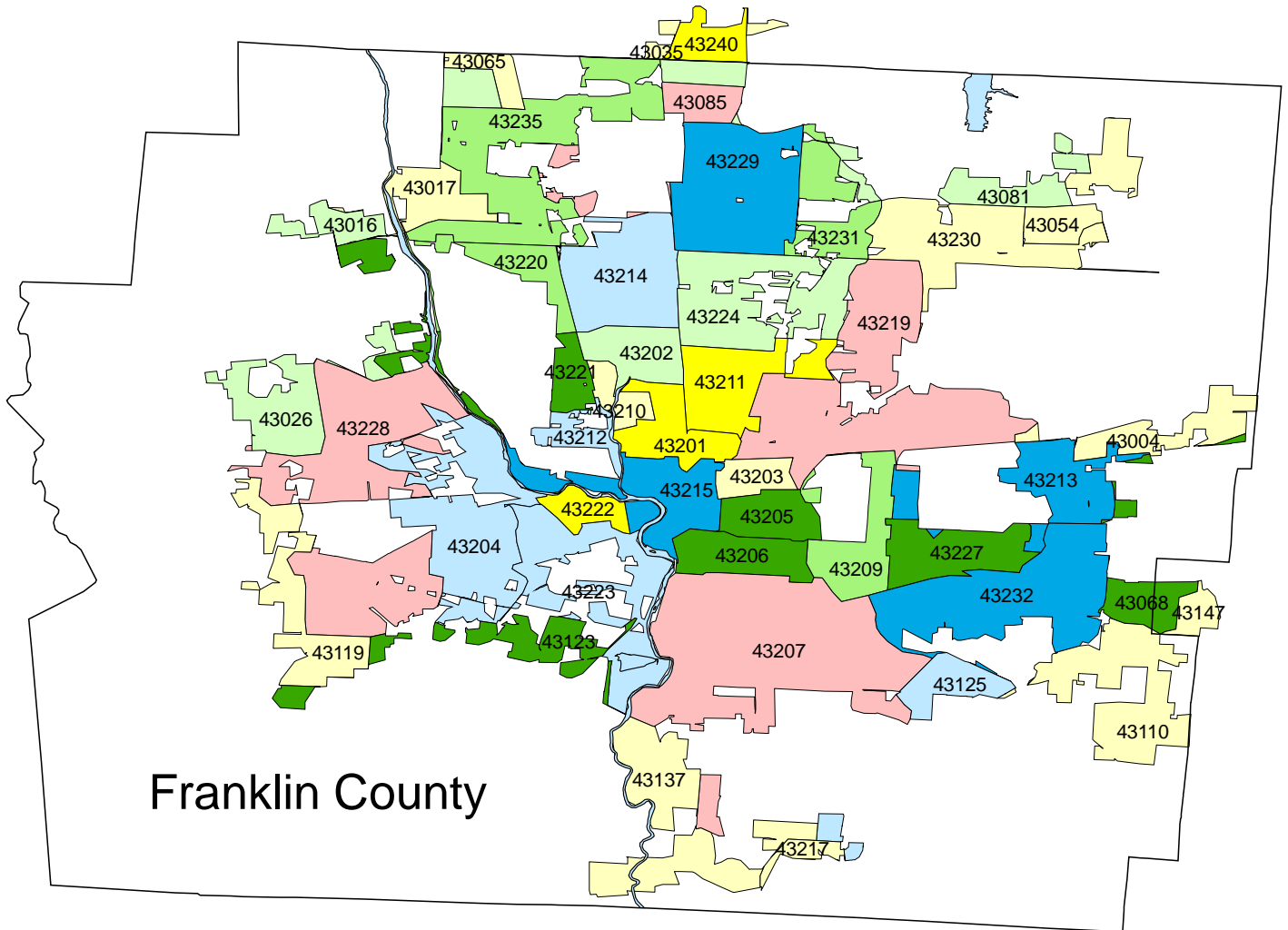

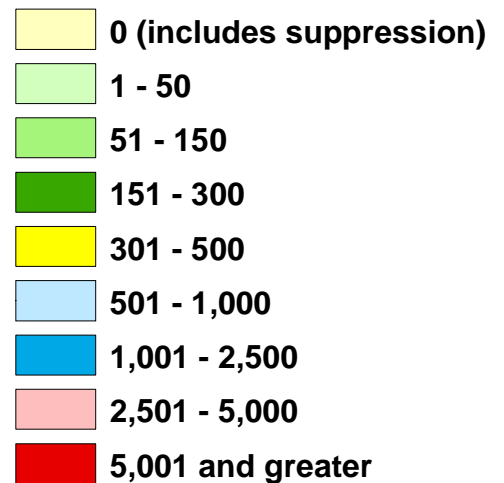


Columbus City NAICS Sector 31-33 Manufacturing Employment by ZIP Code, 1st Quarter 2006

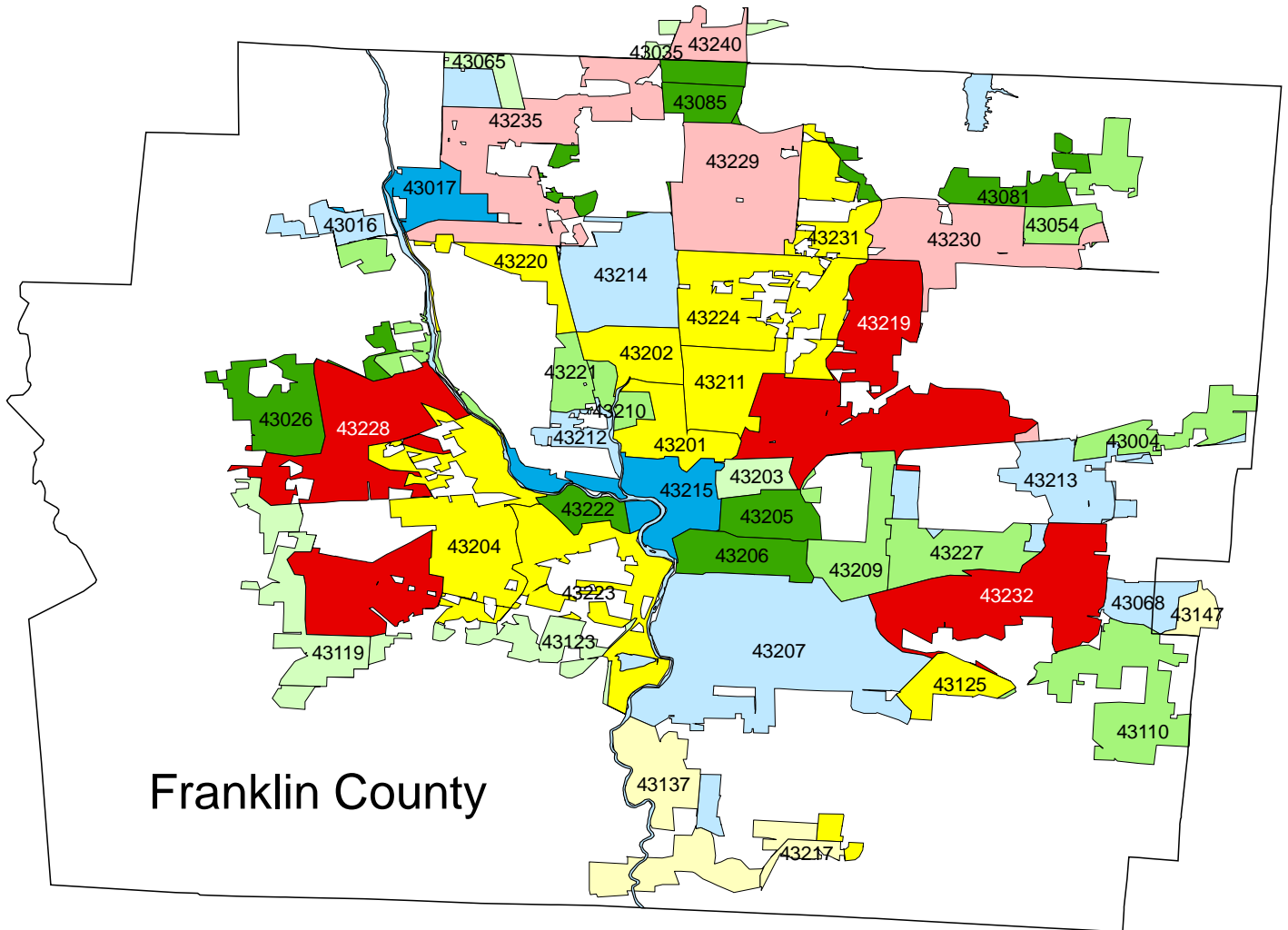

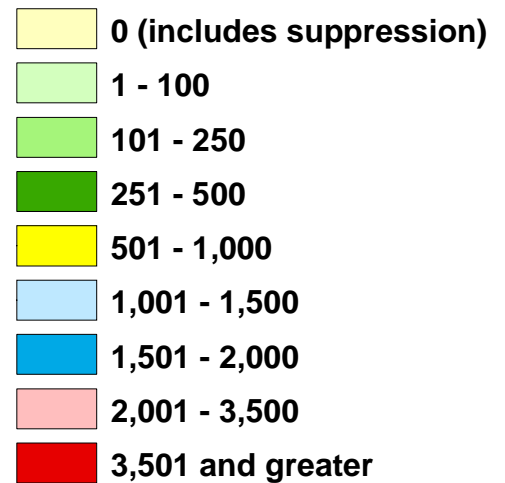


Columbus City NAICS Sector 44-45 Retail Trade Employment by ZIP Code, 1st Quarter 2006

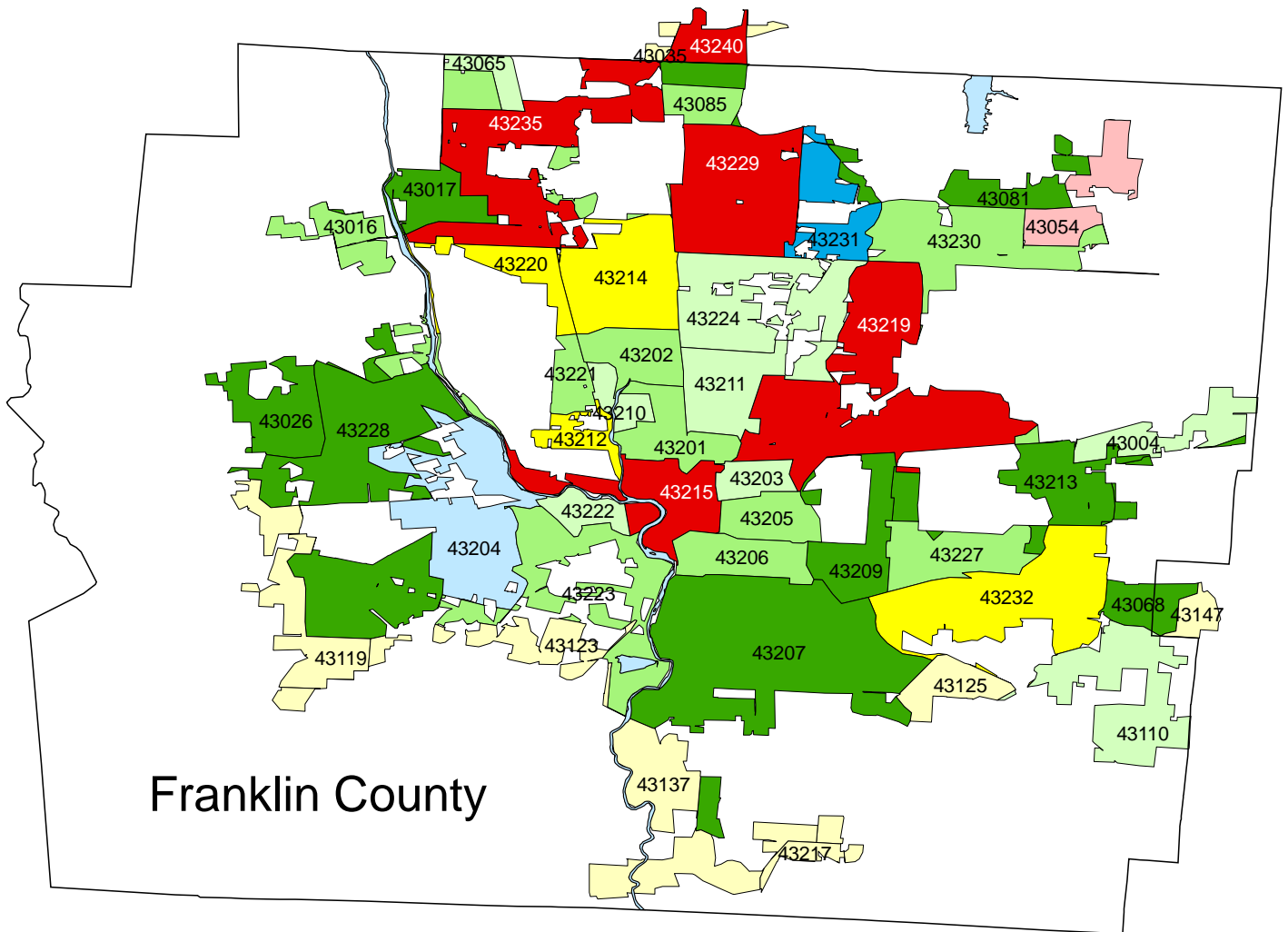

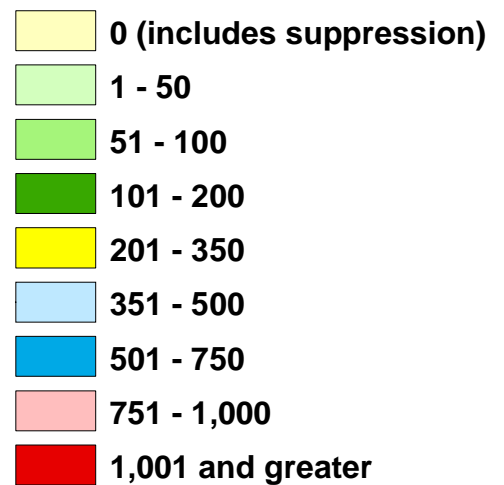


Columbus City NAICS Sector 52 Finance and Insurance Employment by ZIP Code, 1st Quarter 2006

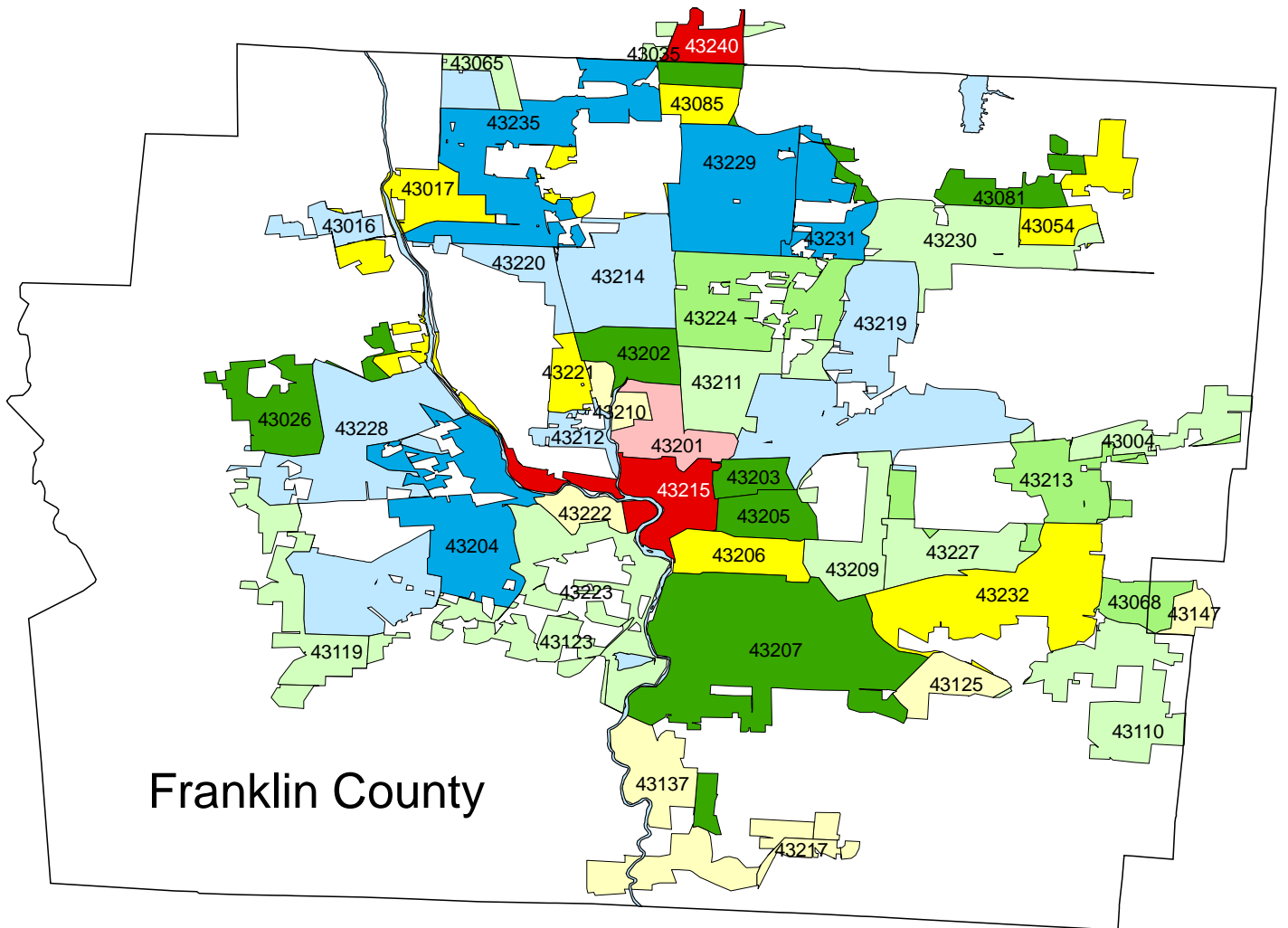

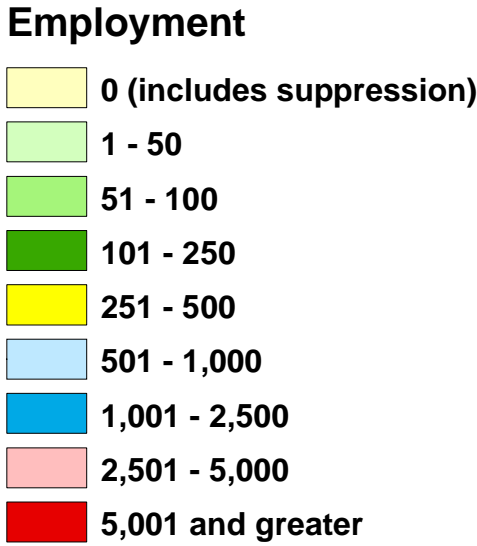

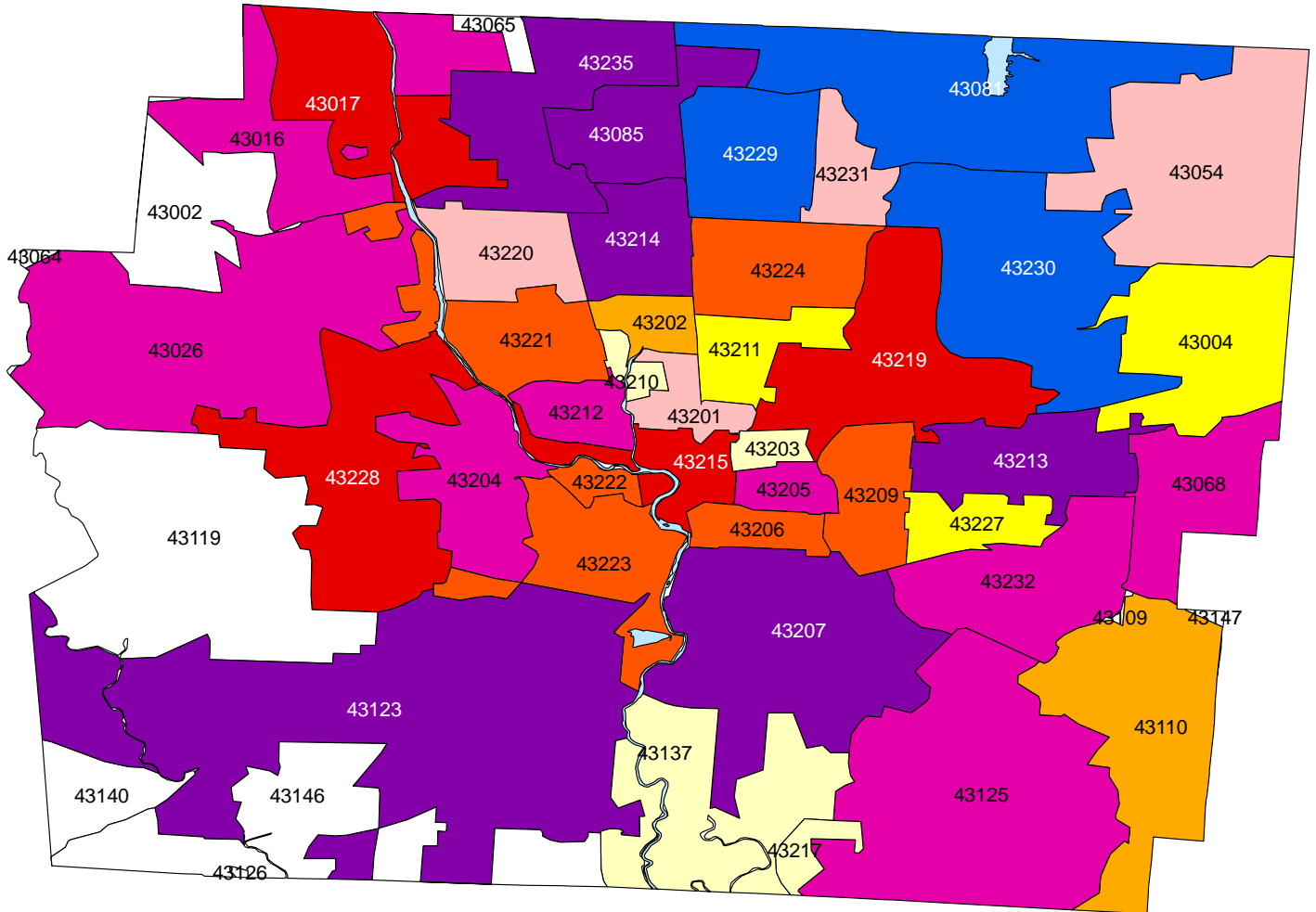
Columbus City NAICS Sector 54 Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services Employment by ZIP Code, 1st Quarter 2006



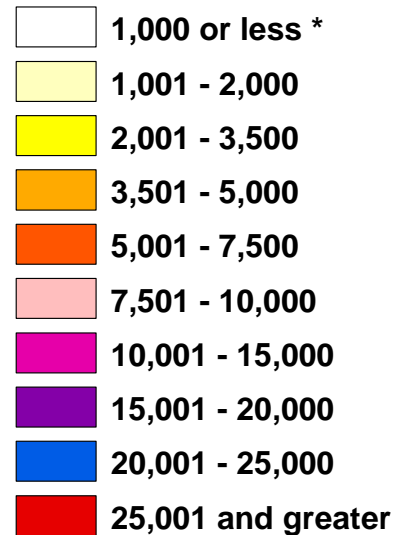

Franklin County Private Covered Employment by ZIP Code, 1st Quarter 2006



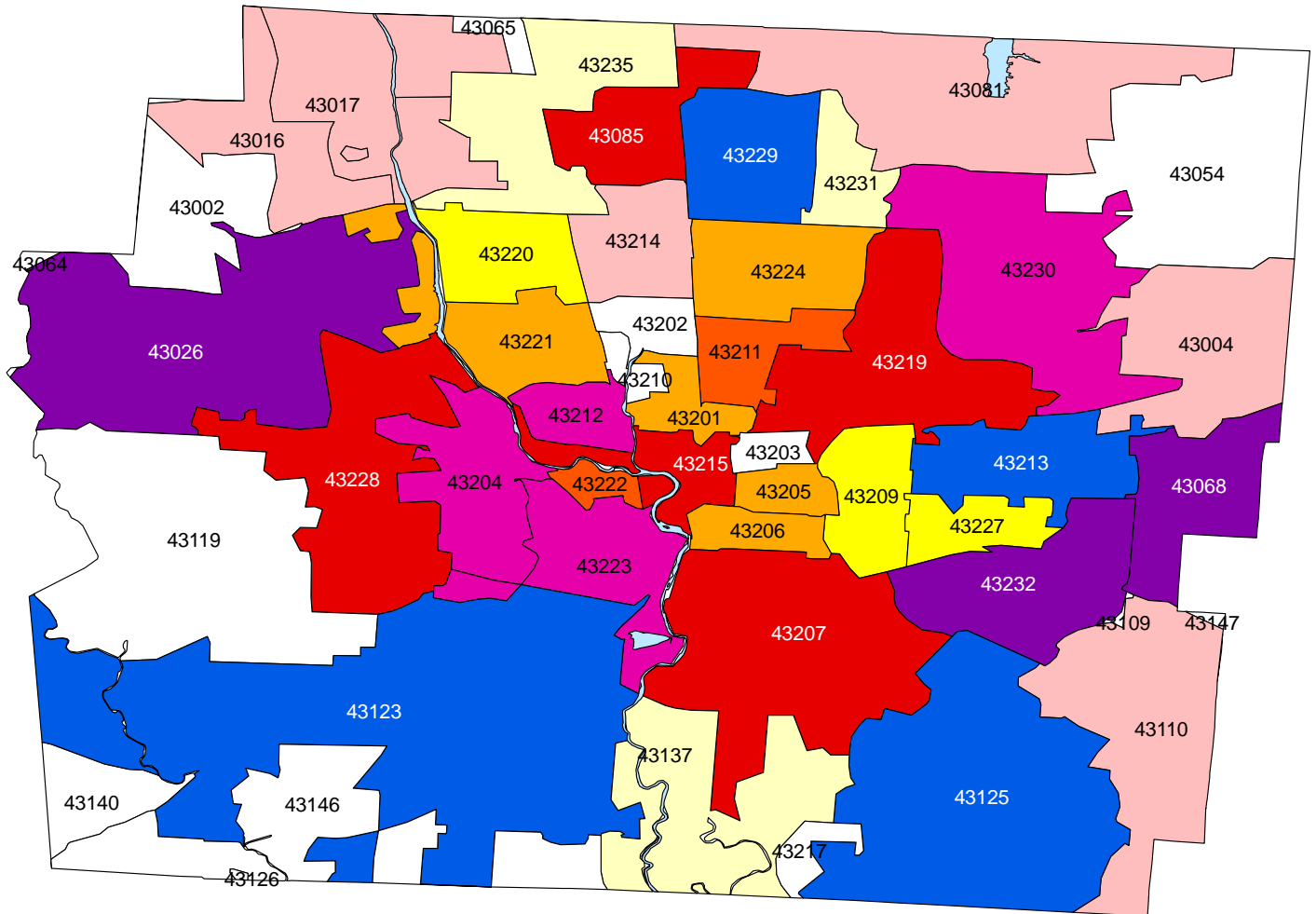

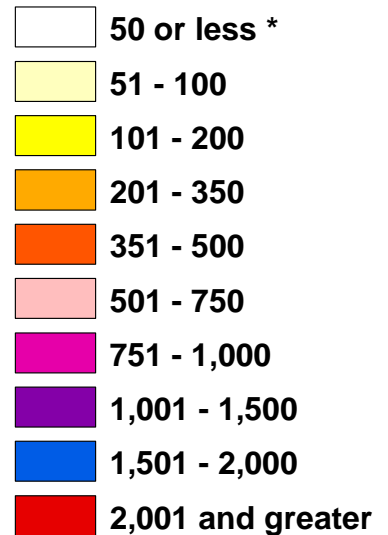

Franklin County NAICS Sector 31-33 Manufacturing Employment by ZIP Code, 1st Quarter 2006

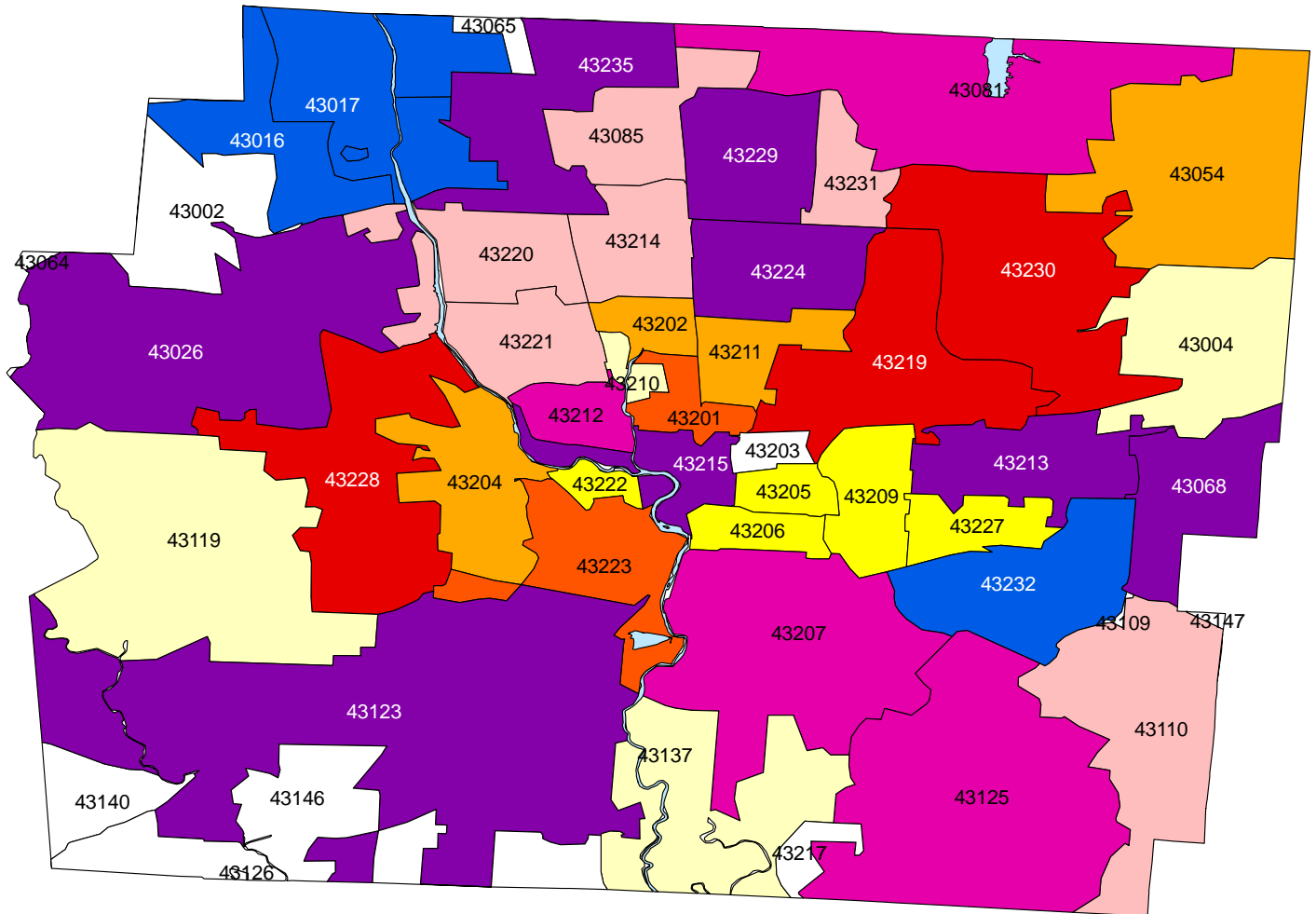

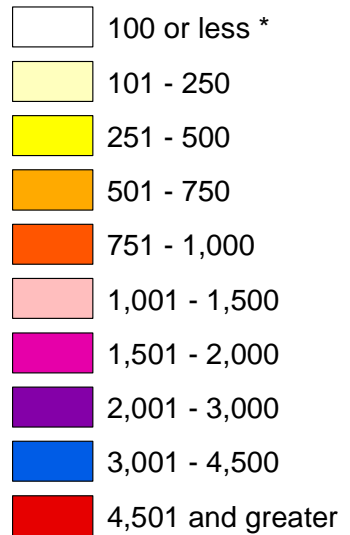

Franklin County NAICS Sector 44-45 Retail Trade Employment by ZIP Code, 1st Quarter 2006

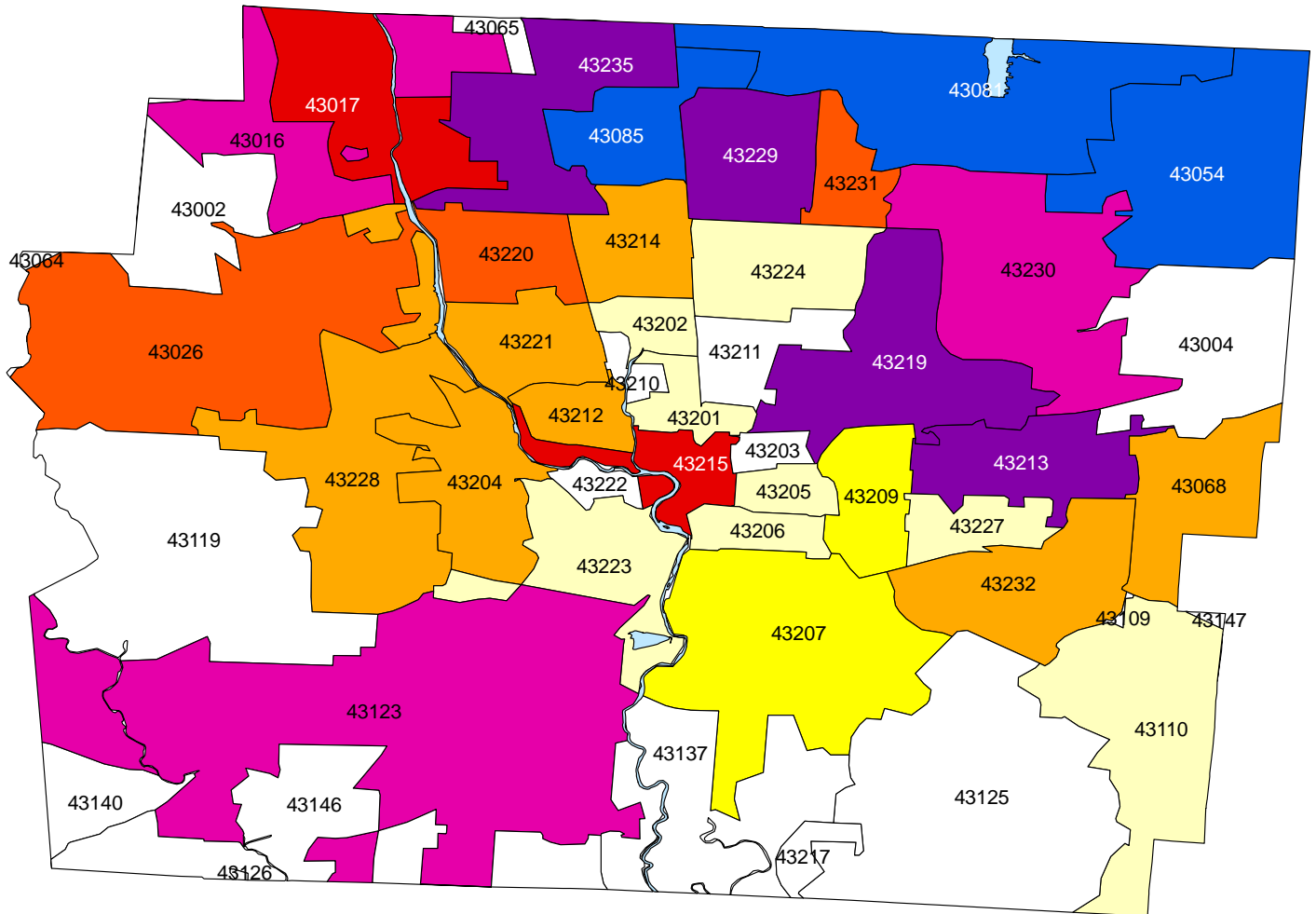

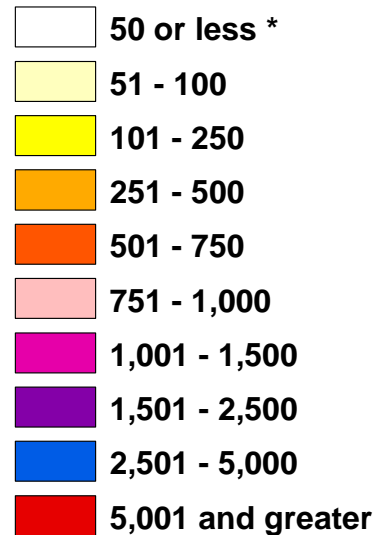

Franklin County NAICS Sector 52 Finance and Insurance Employment by ZIP Code, 1st Quarter 2006

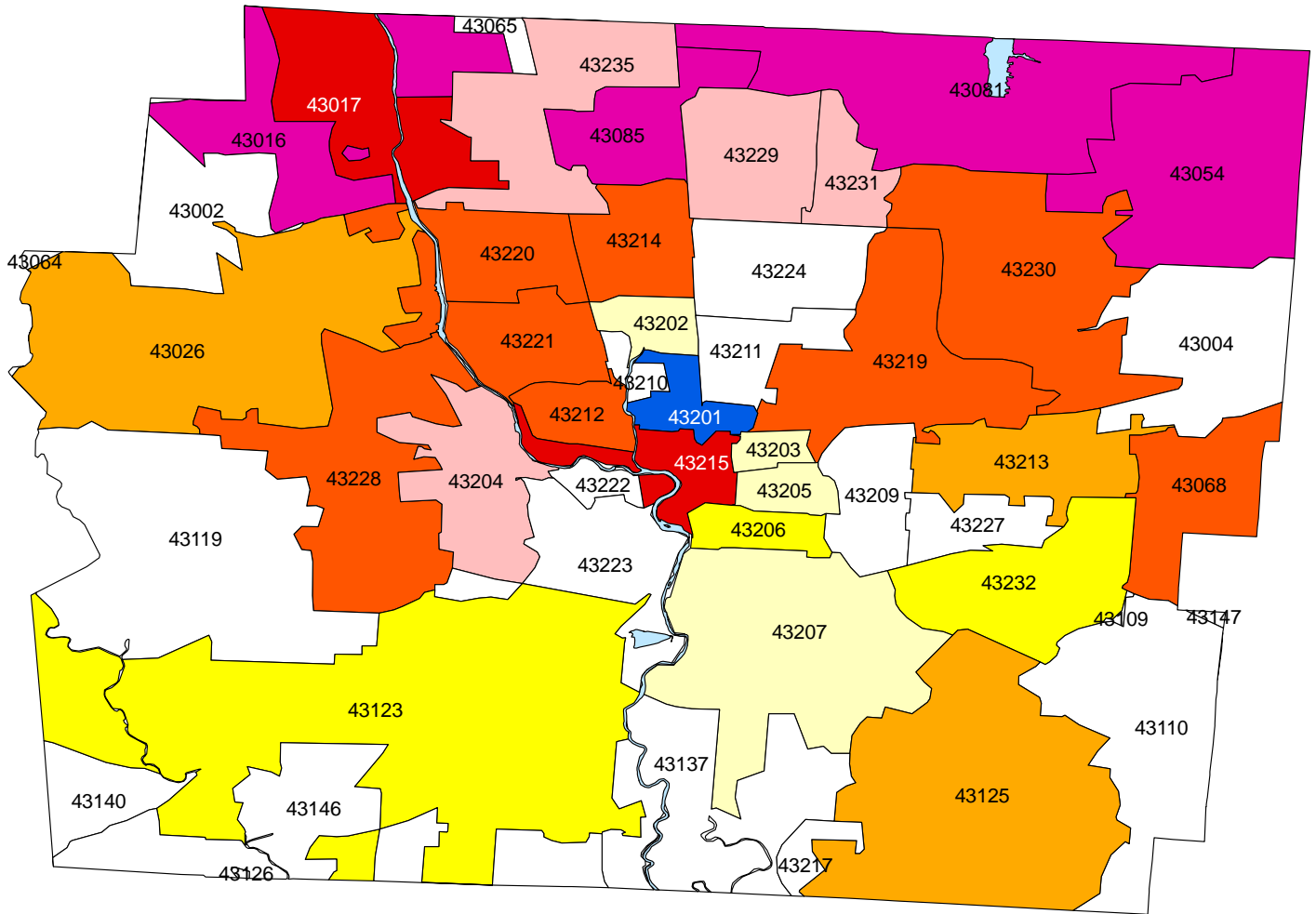

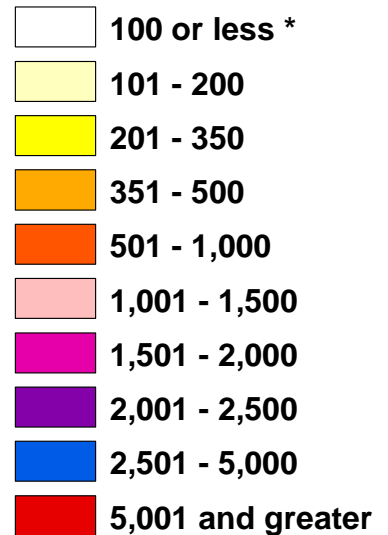
